AIADMK men arrested for burning Annamalai's portraits

Ten cadres of the AIADMK were arrested on Thursday for burning the portraits of BJP State president K. Annamalai. Taking strong exception to the comparison made by Mr. Annamalai with former Chief Minister Jayalalitha, the cadres led by Ravi, joint secretary of the district M.G.R. Mandram, assembled in Meensurthy and began to burn the portraits of Mr. Annamalai. They raised slogans against him for comparing himself with Ms. Jayalalitha, whom they said was an unparalleled leader. They also said that Mr. Annamalai should not test the patience of the AIADMK cadres by provoking them. On information, the police rushed to the spot and arrested them.

Technical glitch delays disembarkation of passengers

A technical glitch in power supply led to delay in disembarkation of passengers from an Air Asia flight soon after its arrival at the Tiruchi international airport from Kuala Lumpur in the late hours on Tuesday.

The incident occurred on March 7 night when the Tiruchi-bound AirAsia flight AK-23 with over 140 passengers on board arrived. Moments after arrival a technical glitch arose with regard to power supply because of which disembarkation of passengers got delayed by about 30 minutes., said airport sources.

Termining it as a "minor technical issue", the sources said power supply was restored after which the passengers disembarked. The departure of the same aircraft to Kuala Lumpur got delayed by one-and-half hours, they said.

Even as migrant workers from various north Indian States expressed happiness over the way they were treated by local people in Virudhunagar district, police have assured them all safety.

Superintendent of Police R. Srinivasa Perumal addressed workers from Chattisgarh, Bihar, Jharkhand, West Bengal and Odisha, working in Ramco Cement Factory, here on Thursday.

He told them that the entire State machinery, from the Chief Minister M.K. Stalin, were taking all efforts to ensure the safety of the migrant workers.

"We have prepared 148 patta passbooks for the police officials across the district focussing on the dwelling places of migrant workers. Every day police

officials would visit all these 148 places and interact with the representatives of migrant workers and sign the patta passbook," the SP said.

A nodal police officer has been appointed.

Over 7,000 migrant workers from North Indian States were employed by 178 companies in the dis-

rumal said.

Besides, the workers were asked to post messages about the real situation in Tamil Nadu to put an end to works of rumour-mongers. The workers said that they did not face any problem with the local people.

"We are working here for the last four to five years. I have come with my brother and sister. We are treated properly by the local people," one of them said.
