## SC defers hearing in HCS recruitment scam

The Supreme Court on Tuesday deferred the hearing on a petition challenging the Punjab and Haryana High Court's order quashing a chargesheet against eight Haryana Civil Services (HCS) officers accused of securing selection through favouritism and manipulation in the 2001 recruitment examination. A Bench of Justices Vikram Nath and Sandeep Mehta posted the matter for hearing on July 21 after state the senior Additional Advocate General, Lokesh Sinhal, informed

it that the Advocate General was suffering from typhoid. Questioning the High Court's order quashing the chargesheet, the top court had, on May 20, asked the Investigating Officer of the case to appear before it on May 26 "along with the relevant material available with him".

The Bench had also requested the Haryana Advocate General to assist it in the matter.

## Sirsa grenade attack: NIA files chargesheet against 9 accused

Says accused were radicalised through social media, encrypted platforms

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) has filed a chargesheet against nine accused, including two Pakistan-based handlers, in connection with the grenade attack on the women police station in Sirsa district in November 2025. The accused named in the chargesheet include Pakistani nationals Shahzad Bhatti and Sohail Ahmad alias Sohail Baloch, along with arrested Indian nationals Dheeraj alias Dhuru, Vikas alias Viky, Sandeep alias Daimar, Vikas, Sushil alias Sillu, Md Sijaan alias Ghazi and Gurjant Singh. The chargesheet was filed

before the Special NIA Court in Panchkula under relevant sections of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita and the Explosive Substances Act.

According to the NIA, the attack was part of a larger conspiracy orchestrated by Pakistan-based gangster-terrorist Shahzad Bhatti to spread terror by targeting police establishments and personnel in India. Investigations revealed that Shahzad and Sohail had allegedly recruited and radicalised the accused through social media platforms and encrypted communication channels.

"In pursuance of the conspiracy, he had established operational modules in India

and assigned local operatives to carry out grenade attacks on police establishments," the agency said.

The NIA identified Dheeraj as the principal India-based operative who coordinated the attacks with local modules on the directions of the Pakistan-based handlers. Probe findings further revealed that after conducting reconnaissance of potential targets, the accused selected the women police station in Sirsa for the attack. Investigators also found that the accused had travelled to Amritsar in Punjab to procure the grenade from co-accused Gurjant Singh.

The grenade attack, carried out on November 25, 2025, was allegedly record-

ed on a mobile phone by the accused for dissemination and publicity.

According to the NIA, the accused remained in touch with the handlers and their aides even after the attack. The investigation has so far established a chain involving recruitment, financing, operational coordination, procurement of explosives and execution of the terror act at the behest of Pakistan-based operatives.

The agency said it was continuing its investigation into the larger conspiracy, including foreign linkages and financial channels connected to the case. Efforts are also underway to trace the absconding accused, official sources said.

## 7-member SIT to probe Gurugram court fire

In a swift response to the devastating fire at the Gurugram District and Sessions Court, the authorities have constituted a seven-member Special Investigation Team (SIT) to conduct a probe into the incident. The SIT, led by ACP (Sadar) Dharambir Singh, will operate under the supervision of DCP (West) Karan Goyal.

The move follows a spot inspection by Forensic Science Laboratory (FSL) teams and the "Scene of Crime" unit, which are working to determine how the fire originated in the court's record room.

Despite the extensive damage to the record room and the subsequent closure of the main court complex, District and Sessions Judge Narender Sura has confirmed that judicial operations remain seamless. To prevent any inconvenience to the public

and legal fraternity, all judicial proceedings previously held in the affected building have been temporarily shifted to the PWD Rest House.

He said the judiciary was working in close coordination with the district administration to reconstruct damaged case files and ensure that urgent matters, such as bail and stay pleas, continued to be heard as scheduled.

The transition to the temporary court premises at the PWD Rest House has been supported by the Gurugram Bar Association. President Chandra Kant Sharma urged the public to ignore rumours regarding the status of court work, assuring that proceedings were being conducted in a systematic manner.

While the assessment of the damage is pending due to lingering heat and structural safety concerns, officials said the reconstruction of records will be handled in a phased, priority-based manner.

## Arjun Chautala's 'I am a cockroach MLA' remark sparks political storm

SIRSA, MAY 26

Haryana politics witnessed fresh controversy on Tuesday after INLD's Rania MLA, Arjun Chautala, described himself as a "cockroach" while attacking the government over democracy and the right to government.

The legislator has also created an email ID — cockroachmla@gmail.com — and invited people to send grievances and questions related to the government.

Speaking to the media, Arjun said, "Community is bigger than caste. My entire generation has been called cockroaches because we ask questions. If questions are not asked, where will democracy survive?" Referring to the "Cockroach Janata Party" concept circulating on social media, he alleged that pages linked to it were banned after gaining popularity.

"I want to tell my cockroach brothers that one more cockroach has joined them. This is not just any cockroach, but a cockroach who is also an MLA. The first MLA of the Cockroach Janata Party has

now emerged," he said.

Arjun said citizens wanting to raise issues with the Haryana Government could reach out to him through email. He added that elected representatives have the authority to seek answers from the government through official procedures.

The INLD MLA said the "Cockroach Janata Party" represented an ideology that aligned with his thinking. "I have continuously fought for youth issues and raised questions in the Assembly," he said.

He further claimed that the move had the blessings of INLD supreme Abhay Chautala. "Our party is INLD and youths in our party are cockroaches because youngsters who ask questions are being labelled that way," he added.

Meanwhile, JJP youth wing chief and Arjun's cousin Divgijay Chautala took a swipe at the remarks. "Our old party always has our sympathy. Today the party has broken and one MLA has joined a cockroach party. It is a matter of concern," he said. — OC

## Anti-Terrorist Squad likely to begin operations from June 1, says DGP

Director General of Police (DGP) Ajay Singhal on Tuesday announced that the state's Anti-Terrorist Squad (ATS) is likely to start functioning from June 1, with dedicated police stations in Panchkula and Gurugram. The decision to operationalise the ATS was taken after the busting of a "white-collar terror module" linked to doctors associated with Al Falah University last year.

Addressing a press conference at Police Headquarters in Panchkula, Singhal said, "An IG-level officer will head the ATS. Two to three SP-rank officers will be part of the team." The ATS will now independently handle terror-related operations, investigations and intelligence gathering in Haryana, responsibilities that were earlier managed by the CID wing of the state police.

The formation of the specialised unit was fast-tracked after the probe into the November 10, 2025 blast near the Red Fort, in which around 15 people were

killed. During investigations, the role of several doctors linked to Al Falah University in Faridabad and some individuals from Kashmir came under the scanner of investigating agencies. Authorities had also recovered nearly 2,900 kg of explosives from two rooms in Faridabad.

The DGP said Haryana had also witnessed attacks targeting police establishments in recent months. An explosive device was detonated near the Women's Police Station in Sirsa on November 25,

while on January 10, 2026, a car loaded with explosives and three gas cylinders was found parked outside the Baldev Nagar Police Station in Ambala. Both incidents were investigated by the National Investigation Agency.

Referring to National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) data, Singhal said Haryana ranked fourth in the country in crime rate under IPC/BNS and fifth under Special Local Laws. He attributed this largely to the high number of power

theft cases and missing person reports registered in the state.

"There is free registration of cases. After an investigation, Haryana is ranked second in India for case cancellations. We want people to have trust in the police, so the free registration policy would continue," he said.

On recent crime incidents, the DGP claimed that all recent murder cases in the state had been solved. Responding to questions regarding police encounters, he denied allegations that police deliberately targeted gangsters in the legs, while accusing sections of the media of sensationalising gangsters.

Singhal also said a constable posted at a check-post in Fatehabad had died due to the heatwave. "There are 200 check-posts that work round the clock across the state. We have provided coolers there, and also a liquid diet to keep them hydrated," he said, adding that more than 40 constables had been removed from check-post duties due to extreme weather conditions.

## State govt reschedules Id-ul-Zuha holiday to May 28

The Haryana Government has revised the gazetted holiday for Id-ul-Zuha (Bakrid), declaring May 28 as a holiday across the state.

According to a notification issued by the state Chief Secretary, Anurag Rastogi, the holiday will be observed in all the government departments, boards, corporations, educational institutions and other establishments functioning under the state government.

Earlier, the gazetted holiday for Bakrid had been notified for May 27.

The revised notification changes the holiday date in accordance with the observance of the festival.

The Haryana Government has also clarified that the holiday on May 28 would be observed under Section 25 of the Negotiable Instruments Act, 1881, making it applicable to institutions covered under the Act as well.

## Rain, thunderstorm likely for three days from tomorrow

Heatwave tightened its grip on the state on Tuesday, with Sirsa recording the highest day temperature at 46°C, according to the India Meteorological Department (IMD). There is no respite on May 27, too, as IMD has issued an orange alert for the state.

The second hottest place on Tuesday was Rohtak, which recorded 45.6°C, followed by Bhiwani at 44.5°C and Narnaul at 44°C. However, some respite is in sight. "A western disturbance is expected to hit Haryana around May 28, and its impact will remain till May 30," said Director, IMD, Chandigarh, Surender Paul.

On May 28, a thunderstorm with gusty winds at speeds of 60-70 kmph is likely at isolated places over Panchkula, Ambala, Yamunanagar, Kurukshetra, Kaithal, Karnal, and Panipat. Light to moderate rainfall is likely to occur in these districts.

Thunderstorm with gusty winds and heatwave are

likely at isolated places over Mahendragarh, Rewari, Jhajjar, Gurugram, Nuh, Palwal, Faridabad, Rohtak, Sonapat, Fatehabad, Hisar, Jind, Bhiwani, Charkhi Dadri, and Sirsa. Light to moderate rainfall is likely in these districts as well.

For May 29 and May 30, light to moderate rainfall is likely at many places over Panchkula, Ambala, Yamunanagar, Kurukshetra, Kaithal, Karnal, Sonapat, and Panipat. Light to moderate rainfall is likely at a few places over Mahendragarh, Rewari, Jhajjar, Gurugram, Nuh, Palwal, Faridabad, Rohtak, Fatehabad, Hisar, Jind, Bhiwani, and Charkhi Dadri. Light to moderate rainfall is likely at Sirsa.

The IMD forecasts no large change in maximum temperatures during the next two days. "Thereafter, there is a fall by 6-8°C for May 29, May 30, and May 31; and then rise by 2-4°C," he said.

## Mewat celebrates Padma Shri for artist Gaffruddin

Long associated with crime and social unrest, Mewat is witnessing a rare moment of pride and cultural celebration after folk artist Gaffruddin Mewati Jogi was conferred the Padma Shri, India's fourth-highest civilian honour, in the field of art.

The award has brought national attention to the region's rich but fading cultural traditions and transformed Gaffruddin into a symbol of Mewat's indigenous heritage. A master of the Bhangam — a rare single-string percussion instrument believed to be inspired by Lord Shiva's damru — Gaffruddin is also regarded as the last surviving custodian of "Pandun ka Kada," a centuries-old Mewati oral folk tradition. The art form comprises over 2,500 dohas (couplets) narrating episodes from the Mahabharata, especially the Pandavas' exile in Viratnagar, present-day Alwar.

Representing the eighth generation of his family to preserve the tradition, Gaffruddin has spent decades keeping alive a cultural legacy that blends music, storytelling and com-

munal harmony.

His journey, however, has been marked by hardship. He began performing alongside his father at the age of four and often went from door to door collecting flour to support the family. Today, the same artist has emerged as a global ambassador of Mewati culture, performing in over 60 countries, including presti-

gious events attended by Queen Elizabeth in London.

Following the announcement of the Padma Shri, villages across Mewat have started organising felicitation ceremonies to honour the artist. The recognition has also reignited conversations around the urgent need to preserve the region's traditional arts and crafts.
