2nd dose at schools, PHCs

TO counter low vaccination coverage of the second dose especially among children in the age group of 12 to 17, the health department in all districts have come up with their action plans.

With the fourth wave predicted in June, district health administrations have begun to conduct special vaccination drives for kids at schools or public health centres near schools while coordinating with school authorities, said Arundathi Chandrashekar, Mission Director, National Health Mission. Of the target 31,75,000 children between 15 and 17 years, 81.45 per cent (25,96,251) have been vaccinated with first dose, and only 68.8 per cent (21,84,630) have received the second dose.

Among the children between the age group of 12 to 14 (20,25,000), 83.86 per cent (16,98,322) are have been inoculated with the first dose while only 18.12 per cent have received the second jab.

Among 4,89,16,000 adults, only 12,83,349 (2.62 per cent) have received the precautionary or the booster dose.

As cases have come down, people are not inclined to take the precautionary dose. However, apprehending the fourth wave, people are coming to take the booster shot, a medical officer of health department said. "In order to improve inoculation of precautionary dose among adults, we have increased information, education and communication through phone calls and messages to persons eligible for the dose. And we are even planning to give precautionary dose at the doorsteps of beneficiaries," Chandrashekar said.

MP Mangala Angadi lists needs of diabetic kids

MP Mangala Angadi stressed on the need to address issues of diabetic children by making them self-confident and capable to accept challenges in their life.

Addressing the gathering during the valedictory ceremony of 22nd Annual Free Summer Camp for Diabetic Children organised by KLES Prabhakar Kore Hospital recently, Mangala said, "The role of parents is vital in ensuring suitable food and lifestyle for making them capable citizens for tomorrow."

Dr Sujata Jali, Paediatric Diabetic Specialist informed that about 40,000 children suffer from type-1 diabetes every year. About 260 diabetic children are admitted in this center and free treatment and insulin is being given to them.

She said, "KLES diabetic centre is the only one in India to treat maximum number of diabetic children. More than about 72 per cent of the children are from rural areas out

of which most of them are from poorer section of the society. Every month five paediatric diabetic patients are admitted at the hospital. For treating these children we need thousands of rupees every year for insulin, which we try to manage with the help of NGOs and other like minded institutions."

More than 160 diabetic children participated in this camp. Various activities such as drawing, singing, dancing, yoga, food preparation, diabetic awareness education etc have been organised for chil-

dren and their mothers. Diabetic children namely Krishna Yadure and Pavitra Karagi (for keeping their sugar level under control) and best parent mother Yamuna Korigiri were awarded gold medals.

Dr M V Jali, Medical Director of KLES Prabhakar Kore Hospital and Dr Vivek Saoji, Vice Chancellor of KAHER also spoke and motivated the children.

Dr V A Kothivala, Registrar, KAHER, Dr N S Mahantshetti, Principal, JNMCC, Dr Sanjay Kambar, Dr HB Rajshekhar, others were present.

Premature babies can survive with advanced care

THOUGH the incidence of premature deliveries has increased by at least 20 per cent over the past two decades due to late marriages, advanced parental age, pregnancies, lifestyle and infections including Covid, still there is hope.

With advanced neonatal care facilities most of the babies can survive and stay healthy. Except for 47 babies of 3,000 premature babies (more than 99 per cent) with the youngest being 24 weeks old, others have

survived in the city-based Rainbow Children's Hospital in the past six years, said Dr Saravanan R, consultant, department of neonatology and paediatrics at the Hospital. Among them, 130 babies weighed less than 1 kg. Except for 11 of them, the rest have survived, he added. It was a moment of joy for parents of at least 100 premature babies who participated, shared their experiences and instilled hope among parents of premature babies at the "Big Little Reunion" hosted by Rainbow Children's hospital in Bengaluru on

Saturday. Dr Saravanan said that among the premature babies born at 24 weeks, with advanced treatment at the hospital, only two suffered long-term complications. While one has difficulty in walking, another had delayed speech, he said. Gestational diabetes and pregnancy-induced hypertension among other reasons can cause premature deliveries, he said, adding that 20 mothers who suffered from Covid-19 delivered premature babies with the youngest being 28 weeks weighing 900 g.

Man gets new lease of life after bilateral lung transplant

A 49-year-old man, who was diagnosed with Interstitial Lung Disease (ILD) five years ago recently underwent bilateral sequential lung transplantation (transplant of both lungs) at SS Sparsh Hospital in RR Nagar, Bengaluru.

The transplant was jointly performed by Dr Kumud Dhital and his thoracic transplant team from Sparsh, and Dr Ravindra Mehta and his pulmonology team from Apollo Hospitals. Dr Dhital is Programme & Surgical Director, Heart & Lung Transplant, Sparsh Hospital and Dr Mehta is Director, Pulmonology, Apollo Hospitals.

"The transplant was done as a part of an MoU between the surgical team of Sparsh Hospitals and the pulmonology team of Apollo Hospitals," said Dr Dhital.

He added that the patient was recently reviewed at Sparsh Hospital for a rapidly progressive end-stage respiratory failure.

ILD is an umbrella term used for a large group of diseases that cause scarring (fibrosis) of the lungs, leading to stiffness in the lungs which makes it difficult to breathe. Lung damage from ILDs is often irreversible and tends to worsen with time.

Speaking about the procedure to TNSE, Dr Dhital said while waiting for the transplant, the patient had lost a lot of weight.

"The bilateral lung transplantation is a high-risk procedure. In heart and lung transplants, regardless of the blood group and tissue typing, sizing is very important. The donor's lungs should fit the size of the chest cavity of the recipient. Lungs tend to shrink. We often cannot use donor lungs because of size mismatch," he explained. In this case, he said, the donor lungs were earlier rejected by another hospital. "In this case too, they were a little over sized but we waited and allowed them to adjust to the recipient's cavity," added the surgeon.
