

Inordinate delay in Lokayukta reports, says L-G

Saxena says it is incumbent upon higher public functionaries to display alertness in matters of public importance

STOKING yet another controversy, Lieutenant Governor (L-G) V K Saxena on Friday accused that the city government of an “inordinate delay” of three years in submission of Lokayukta reports that highlight the issues faced by the anti-corruption ombudsman in terms of independence, lack of powers, and financial autonomy.

Saxena has flagged this issue in a letter written to the Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal.

“I would like to advise that the minister concerned may please be guided appropriately to dispose such important matters of public interest within reasonable period, so that the statutory purpose of laying it before the legislative assembly is not de-

feated and Delhi is not deprived of its wisdom,” he said.

The L-G also asked Kejriwal to recall that even on earlier occasion, such delays were brought to the chief minister’s notice and subsequently, the matter was placed in the assembly.”

Saxena also pointed out that being the custodian of public trust, it is the incumbent upon higher public functionaries to display appropriate alertness in matters of public importance.

According to the sources at L-G secretariat, Saxena received the 16th and the 17th annual consolidated reports of the Lokayukta of Delhi, pertaining to 2017-18 and 2018-19, after a delay of three years from the city government. However, the reports have been approved by him to table before the Delhi assembly.

The reports highlighting various constraints being faced by the Lokayukta in terms of its ‘independence’, ‘lack of powers’,

‘compromised financial autonomy’ and ‘limited jurisdiction’, among others, were first submitted to the L-G on October 1, 2019. On October 23, 2019, the then L-G had sent reports to the chief secretary for an explanation of the government on the points raised by the Lokayukta, said sources.

“Instead of laying down these reports before the legislative assembly, so that they are debated for further strengthening the system of Lokayukta, the delay has deprived the assembly from taking cognisance of these important reports which deal with matters of corruption, abuse or misuse of position in cases of public functionaries,” a source said.

Reacting to the issue, the Delhi government in a statement said, “The L-G should stop behaving like a school headmaster.”

AAP flags illegality in construction of MCD’s old age home

NEW DELHI: The ruling-AAP on Friday alleged illegality and irregularities in the construction of an old age home by the Municipal Corporation of Delhi and took a swipe at the BJP. AAP MCD in-charge and MLA Durgesh Pathak said the civic body’s audit report reveals that the responsibility of building old age homes lies with the state government, but it got the building constructed illegally. “The old age home was built but never used, now the barely 6-7 years old building is about to collapse,” he alleged.

157 TREES TO BE SHIFTED FOR 2 BLOCKS AT IIT

THE Delhi government has cleared a proposal for the construction of a mini academic block and an engineer block at the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), Delhi, for which 157 trees will be transplanted, Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal said on Friday. Kejriwal said 1,570 new trees will be planted on the IIT campus where new labs and research spaces will come up under the newly announced project.

“We have approved a proposal for the construction of a new mini academic block and a new engineer block at IIT Delhi. 157 trees will be removed and transplanted inside the campus,” said Kejriwal.

He said this decision will go a long way in serving future engineers and researchers.

“Our government will leave no stone unturned in ensuring quality education for our students,” he added.

According to a statement issued by the government, IIT had sent a proposal to remove and transplant 157 trees to clear its construction site.

Kejriwal has approved the project against the condition of IIT taking up the plantation of 1,570 trees inside its campus, the statement said.

“Approving the proposal, the government has noted that out of the 157 trees, IIT will transplant 82 trees, while it will take up felling of 75 trees only. The transplantation will take place within the identified project site,” the statement said. It added that any tree found to have a nest of birds will not be allowed to be felled or transplanted till the birds abandon the tree.

The government also made it mandatory for IIT to plant 10 times the trees, in lieu of the removal and transplantation.

Under the proposal, various species of trees such as Neem, Amaltas, Pipal, Pilkhan, Gular, Mango and Sheesham, among others will be planted.

Why price tag on survivors of rape, asks High Court

THE Delhi High Court has held that the maximum compensation of ₹7 lakh laid down under the law for rape victims is to be considered as minimum base while adjudicating the issue about survivors of child sexual abuse, and asking how there can there be price tag on survivors.

The high court, which said that no amount of compensation can undo the trauma of the victim, observed that fiscal compensation can be of assistance in rehabilitation of the survivor.

Justice Jasmeet Singh directed that the authorities have to disburse 25 per cent of the maximum amount as the interim compensation within 60 days of filing of the charge sheet against the accused and the special court, holding the trial in the case, shall adjudicate the compensatory proceedings, form a preliminary opinion and grant an interim compensation with the primary objective to rehabilitate.

“It shall award 25 per cent of the maximum compensation as interim compensation. It can even exceed 25 per cent of the maximum compensation as interim compensation after giving reasons,” said the high court.

HC seeks reply on MCD’s take on ‘unlisted’ dogs

THE Delhi High Court has sought the stand of the Centre and the Municipal Corporation of Delhi on a petition challenging the civic body’s power to ‘detain’ and ‘destroy’ unregistered and unclaimed dogs found wandering in public places.

A bench of Chief Justice Satish Chandra Sharma and Justice Subramonium Prasad issued a notice on the public interest litigation petition filed by Kamini Khanna, who has claimed that she has moved the plea on behalf of all dogs of Delhi and that the recent incidents of dog bites in Noida and Ghaziabad were staged.

The petition has also challenged MCD’s advisory asking citizens to register their pets in light of an increasing number of dog-bite cases and sought a direction to restrain the authorities from removing, killing or harming any street dog.

It has argued that care-givers may be discouraged from providing meals to the community dogs as they would want to wriggle out of the responsibility to get the dogs registered, which would deprive the animals of one decent meal and give arbitrary power to the MCD to kill, remove or detain dogs, which could also result in extortion and have serious implication on law and order.

Drive to turn off vehicles at signals soon

THE Delhi government will launch the ‘Red Light on, Gaadi off’ campaign once again to curb vehicular pollution from October 28, Environment Minister Gopal Rai said on Friday.

Under the campaign, first launched on October 16, 2020, to cut down vehicular pollution in the city, drivers are encouraged to switch off their vehicles while waiting for the traffic light to turn green.

Rai said experts are of the view that pollution levels may increase in Delhi after Diwali if the wind direction changes.

“The government is on alert. We are strictly implementing all the directions of the Commission for Air Quality Management. Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Friday reviewed the implementation of the 15-point action plan to curb air pollution in winter,” he said.

Along with dust and biomass burning, vehicular emissions is one of the major contributors to the national capital’s pollution generated locally, the environment minister said.

“Therefore, the government has decided to launch ‘Red Light on Gaadi off’ campaign to curb vehicular pollution from October 28 for one month,” Rai said.

He said that 2,500 civil defence volunteers will be deployed to monitor its implementation at 100 key traffic intersections.

Ten volunteers will be deployed at each traffic signal in two shifts. The major focus will be on 10 big traffic intersections in the city where 20 volunteers each will be stationed.

Data from the Petroleum Conservation Research Association (PCRA) shows that if people switch off engines at traffic signals, pollution can be cut down by 13-20 per cent.

According to government estimates, the transport sector accounts for 28 per cent of the PM2.5 emissions in Delhi.

Vehicular contribution also makes up 80 per cent of nitrogen oxides and carbon monoxide in the city’s air.

100 key traffic points to be targeted

‘Centre’s refusal to give cash incentive to farmers affected stubble burning’

NEW DELHI: ENVIRONMENT Minister Gopal Rai on Friday said the Centre’s blunt refusal to provide cash incentive to farmers in Punjab for not burning crop residue has impacted the campaign against stubble burning in the agrarian state.

In July, Delhi and Punjab governments had jointly sent a proposal to the Centre and the Commission for Air Quality Management (CAQM) to help them give ₹2,500 per acre as cash incentive to farmers in Punjab for not burning stubble.

Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann said in September the Centre had turned down the proposal. Farmers say a cash incentive can help them cover the cost of fuel used in operating the machinery for the in-situ management mixing crop residue in soil of paddy straw.

The minister said stubble burning in any area will have an impact on Delhi’s air if the wind direction changes.

“We have been talking to the

Punjab government, but the problem is that farmers demanded financial support for not burning stubble. The government then prepared a proposal that said Delhi and Punjab would give ₹500 each and the Centre should contribute ₹1,500.

“The way the Centre has bluntly denied the request... it has impacted the entire campaign against stubble burning in the state. But the state government is conducting awareness campaigns and we hope that there will be fewer fire events this year as compared to last year. There would have been a big impact on stubble burning had the Centre provide support,” he said.

According to Punjab government officials, the Centre rejected the proposal saying it has been providing subsidised machinery to them such as happy seeder, rotavator and mulcher for the in-situ management of paddy straw and it didn’t have money to dole out cash incentives.

Teachers to get better environment, facilities at new SCERT block: Dy CM

DEPUTY Chief Minister Manish Sisodia on Friday inaugurated a new training block with state-of-the-art facilities to train in-service teachers at the State Council of Educational Research and Training.

The block has five training halls, an auditorium, conference room, faculty office, inset room and a canteen. Sisodia said the new facilities will take the teachers’ training standards to “new heights” in the national capital. “Our teachers can be trained in a good environment with better facilities. This new block will also act as a centre for research and innovation in the field of education in Delhi,” Sisodia said.

He added that while the government has provided the facilities, it is SCERT’s ‘responsibility’ to ensure proper training for teachers in the new block.

“The government has done the work of providing facilities for this training but beyond this, it is SCERT’s responsibility to ensure

excellent training for the teachers. SCERT has played an important role in the formulation of Mindset Curricula and Delhi education revolution,” said Sisodia.

He added that in the academic session 2021-22, SCERT has trained more than 82,000 teachers for ‘Mission Buniyaad’ and so far 39,405 teachers have been trained under

three Mindset curriculum in the current session.

“The teacher-training management system developed by SCERT will prove to be very helpful for teachers and their professional development. This will include a database of 62,000 teacher profiles, training assignments, growth and training resources,” he said.

Navy's warning shot injures fisherman

A 32-year-old fisherman from Mayiladuthurai was injured after Indian Navy fired "warning shots" on his boat in mid-sea near Kodiyakara on Friday. TN Chief Minister MK Stalin, who announced a solatium of ₹2 lakh, urged PM Narendra Modi to direct security agencies to exercise extreme caution and restraint while dealing with Indian fishermen in Indian waters. The Navy has ordered a probe into the incident.

Veeravel, who was airlifted by a naval chopper, was first rushed to Ramanathapuram GH for treatment. He was later taken to Madurai GH for specialized care. According to sources, he is stable.

The Navy said its ship intercepted a suspicious boat on the Palk Bay. As the vessel did not stop despite repeated calls, warning shots were fired as per SOP to halt it, a Defence PRO tweet said. According to sources, Veeravel of Vanagiri village in Mayiladuthurai district and nine others from Mayiladuthurai and Karaikal set out for sea on October 15.

4 cops suspended for Thoothukudi firing

Chennai: Three days after the Justice Anna Jagadeesan committee report on the Thoothukudi police firing was tabled in the assembly, TN home department on Friday suspended ACP Thirumalai, constable and ace shooter Sudalai Kannu, and constables Satish and Shankar. ENS

On Friday, when they were fishing near Kodiyakara, Indian Navy fired on their boat multiple times and Veeravel sustained injuries to his leg and stomach. A rescue chopper from INS Parundu rushed to the spot and airlifted him to Rameswaram. After first-aid he was rushed to Ramanathapuram GH and later to Madurai Government Rajaji Hospital. Ramanathapuram District collector Johny Tom Varghese and SP P Thangadurai visited the fisherman. Fisheries Minister Anitha R Radhakrishnan said, "Four pellets were removed from Veeravel's body. He is stable."

3 die cleaning septic tank in resort, 2 held

THREE persons, belonging to the SC community, who were cleaning a septic tank at a private resort in Sriperumbudur in Kancheepuram district, died of asphyxiation on Friday morning.

The manager of the resort, Murali and the contractor Rajini, who undertook the cleaning work, have been arrested on Friday while the owner of the resort, Sathyamoorthy is on the run, police said. The deceased

Ranganathan, 51, Naveen Kumar, 30, and Thirumalai, 18, were from Katchipadu village in Kancheepuram district. Rajini employed them for the work on Friday morning.

"Around 11am, the trio entered the 5,000-litre capacity septic tank and did not come out. They reportedly inhaled the poisonous gas and lost consciousness inside. Another person Kumar, raised an alarm, after the trio failed to come out," said M Sudhakar, SP, Kancheepuram district. Sriperumbudur Fire and

Rescue personnel reached the spot, and recovered the bodies, which were sent to the Sriperumbudur Government Hospital for postmortem. The relatives and villagers from Katchipadu protested against the resort management.

Sriperumbudur MLA K Selvaputhuram visited the bereaved families and consoled them. The Sriperumbudur police have registered a case under various sections of the IPC for, and Prohibition of Employment as Manual Scavenger and their Rehabilitation

Act, 2013, and Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989. Speaking to *The New Indian Express*, M Aarathi, Collector of Kancheepuram district said, "We will receive ₹10 lakh compensation for each person from the resort owner and an additional ₹12 lakh compensation will be provided by the government in two instalments."

The hotel management is at fault in engaging manual labourers to remove blockage, she said.

9 held for trespassing, demolishing school wall

NINE persons, including a woman, were arrested by High Grounds police for alleged trespassing and demolishing the compound of Kamala Bai School on Queen's Road, while the case over ownership of the property is still pending before a court. The advocate representing the accused has written to the Chief Justice of Karnataka and police commissioner, accusing them of intervening in a civil dispute.

Police said there is a dispute over a three-acre plot on the premises of the school, and the court had recently passed a temporary injunction. However, a gang demolished compound wall of the school on Thursday night. They allegedly assaulted some members of Kamala Bai Education Trust who tried to stop them. An FIR was registered earlier too.

However, Samad Khan, the advocate, submitted a petition to the Chief Justice and police commissioner, seeking action against the police.

Lab equipment worth ₹40L damaged, says college

"THE government had sanctioned Rs 2 crore for renovation. The bhoomi puja was scheduled on Saturday," the principal said.

The management has declared a two-day holiday. However, the students will resume their classes in the new building which has 25 rooms. A

chemistry lecturer told TNIE that she, along with three other staff members, were in the lab in the morning but after noticing plaster falling from the ceiling, they left the room. The college, built by the Wadiyars, has 3,850 students, 350 faculty members, 50 staff, 30 UG and PG departments. College authorities claim that laboratory equipment worth ₹40 lakh was

crushed under the debris. Historian and Heritage Committee member Echanuru Kumar told TNIE that the committee conducted an inspection of the Maharani's College in 2017 and recommended urgent repair and renovation work. Maharani College staff said there is seepage in botany, microbiology, computer science and zoology and most of the laboratories.

Tracing the history of the college, Kumar said the college was constructed by Wadiyars. Among the illustrious personalities who have visited the college are Rabindranath Tagore who addressed the students in 1919, and Sarojini Naidu. Mahatma Gandhi's daughter-in-law Sarawathi Gandhi is an alumnus of the college.
