

CM instructs TN DGP to take action against dumping of Kerala wastes

IN his visit to Tenkasi on December 8, Chief Minister MK Stalin instructed Director General of Police (DGP) C Sylendra Babu to take action against dumping of waste from Kerala along Tamil Nadu's borders. According to a statement, issued by Superintendent of Police R Krishnaraj, Stalin had expressed his concerns over health and environmental issues. "The DGP has ordered the Superintendent of Police of

Kanniyakumari and Tenkasi districts to stop the illegal dumping of wastes from Kerala. Consultation meetings with the truck owners federation are being held," read the statement.

The police added that two cases were registered in Thiruvengadam and one in Alangulam limits against those involved in the smuggling of Kerala wastes. Nine persons have been arrested and seven trucks have been seized in this connection. Forty five vehicles,

bringing the wastes to Tamil Nadu via Puliyarai check post were fined and sent back to the neighbouring state. "On December 13, Uthumalai police arrested Krishnakumar, a resident of Punalur in Kerala, and Karuppasamy, a middleman from Tirunelveli who illegally brought plastic and tyre wastes from Kerala. Their vehicles have been seized. IG (South Zone) Asra Garg has formed a special police team to curb the illegal transportation of bio-medical wastes," they added.

Permit farmers to kill wild pigs, says Vaiko

DEMANDING the state government to permit civic bodies to control the menace of wild pigs spoiling crops, over 1,000 farmers headed by MDMK head quarters secretary Durai Vaiko has petitioned district collector Dr K Senthil Raj.

"Wild pigs have become a major threat for agriculture in Vilathikulam, Pudur, Kovilpatti and Kayathar where the animal has ravaged short term crops like black gram, green gram, maize cultivated in several thousand acres. The state government should assess the damages caused by the wild pigs, whose population is on the rise," read the petition, which suggested

the forest department form a committee at village level to control its menace.

He also demanded the union government to shift the wild pigs from the third chapter of the Wild Life Protection Act, 1972, to the fifth chapter containing vermin list, so that prior permission would not be necessary to quell its population.

Noting that the union government had placed wild pigs of Uttarakhand and Bihar under the vermin list for one year in 2016, he said the same government turned down the demand of the Kerala government. "The government in Kerala formed a village level committee to control its population as the union government had turned down the demand", he said.

HC bans felling of trees in Megamalai forest for six weeks

Court asks forest officials to file status report on action against unauthorised cutting of trees

THE Madurai Bench of the Madras High Court on Monday directed the state forest department to file status reports on the progress of the departmental proceedings initiated against some forest officials for failing to prevent unauthorised felling of trees by an estate owner in Megamalai forest area, within six weeks. A Bench of justices R Mahadevan and J Sathya Narayana Prasad further directed the authorities not to permit anyone to cut trees in the reserve forest in the meantime.

The Bench issued the directions on a Public Interest Litigation (PIL) filed by MJ Jayepal in 2013, seeking CBI probe into illegal cutting down of trees by the estate owner in the reserve forest of Megamalai wildlife sanctuary and the alleged involvement of the forest officials in the said illegal activity. According to the order, the district committee of Theni, in 2013, had granted permission to the estate owner to fell 199 murungai trees, 21 neem trees, 31,875 coffee plants and 14,600 cardamom plants, among others. But

misusing the permission, the estate owner had allegedly cut down hundreds of trees of various species.

The authorities had informed the court that after the issue came to light, disciplinary action was taken against a wildlife warden, a forest range officer, a forester, forest guard and a forest watcher and they were suspended and transferred to other divisions. But the judges opined though the illegal activity had been reported way back in 2012, there is little to no progress in the departmental inquiry even after the lapse of ten years.

"Felling of trees in a reserve forest without prior permission from the competent authority is an illegal act. It not only depletes the forest cover, but disturbs the ecological balance in and around the area. It also leads to soil erosion and alters the micro-climate of the area, thereby affecting the wildlife habitat," the judges observed. They further sought a status report of the criminal proceedings initiated against the estate owner with respect to the cutting down of 114 native trees in 2012.

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ALLOCATE MORE FUNDS TO DEVELOP TAMIL LANGUAGE, HIGH COURT DIRECTS TN GOVT

Madurai: The Madurai Bench of Madras High Court on Tuesday directed the State government to take more earnest efforts to develop Tamil language by increasing the allocation of funds and conducting various programmes to familiarise Tamil literature, both Sangam and modern. A Bench of justices R Mahadevan and J Sathya Narayana Prasad gave the direction while disposing of a PIL filed by an advocate B Stalin in 2017, seeking direction to create necessary infrastructure and provide more books and research documents relating to Tamil language for the library in the World Tamil Sangam in Madurai. The petitioner alleged that the government and the Tamil sangam were not taking adequate steps to propagate the beauty and elegance of the language. However, after perusing the reports filed by the government, the judges came to the conclusion that the government is taking all efforts to develop Tamil language and the World Tamil Sangam is also marching towards fulfilling the objectives with which it was established. They therefore disposed of the petition with the above direction. ENS

Man killed, three injured as car rams tree on road

Tenkasi: A 38-year-old man died and three of his friends were severely injured after their car rammmed a roadside tree near Old Courtallam on Tuesday. The police identified the deceased as N Sankar, a resident of C N Kiraamam. "Sankar, his friends A Karthikeyan, P Venkatesh and C Lenin was headed to Tirunelveli, back from Old Courtallam in a car after bathing in the waterfalls. At one point, their car skidded off the road and rammmed a tree on the roadside. While Sankar died, his friends were severely injured," said sources. ENS

Kanniyakumari: A 24-year old man attempted to end his life at the entrance of Kanniyakumari district collectorate in Nagercoil on Tuesday. Police sources said the man, Kannan from Kunjanvilai, was sent to the hospital for treatment. The man and her friend had differences, inquiry is on, they added. ENS

'Operate special train through Tirunelveli'

Kanniyakumari: District-based consumer protection association has urged the railway authorities to operate the Kanniyakumari-Dibrugarh special train via Tirunelveli and Madurai. SR Sreeram, functionary of the association, said the railway department had recently announced

a special train 05906/05905 Kanniyakumari-Dibrugarh. "If any passenger from the Kanniyakumari district takes this train, they have to travel an additional 7 hours and an additional distance of 210 km. This is against consumer law and consumer rights," he added. ENS
