Oram, Pradhan, Vaishnaw: Trio from Odisha in NDA

WITH ODISHA one of the brightest spots in the BJP's Lok Sabha election showing, the party's popular tribal face from the state and six-time Sundargarh MP Jual Oram, Sambalpur MP Dharmendra Pradhan, and the party's Rajya Sabha MP from the state Ashwini Vaishnaw entered the Council of Ministers.

With BJP assuming power in Odisha for the first time, both Oram and Pradhan were considered front-runners for CM's post.

JUAL ORAM

Oram, 63, served as the Union Cabinet Minister twice in the past. In his second term as an MP in 1999, Oram was assigned to head the tribal affairs ministry after the Atal Bihari Vajpayee government set up the ministry following the bifurcation of the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment. He was re-inducted again in 2014 when Narendra Modi assumed power for the first time and again got the tribal affairs portfolio.

In the just-concluded elections, Oram defeated hockey icon and BJD candidate Dilip Tirkey from his traditional base Sundargarh by more than 1.38 lakh votes. Oram, who won the seat five times between 1998 and 2019, made an emotional pitch during the campaign, seeking votes in what he billed as his "last election".

The decision to include Oram in the Union Cabinet is

also seen as the BJP's attempt to further strengthen its base among the tribals in Odisha, who comprise around 23% of the population. Oram is also known as a strong critic of outgoing CM Naveen Patnaik.

Born into a poor tribal family in Kendudihi village in Sundargarh district, Oram completed his engineering degree in 1982 and worked in Bharat Heavy Electricals Limited before entering politics. Oram was elected to the Assembly in 1989 before moving on to national politics.

DHARMENDRA PRADHAN

Pradhan 54, has served as a Union Minister in Modi's two previous terms, handling key portfolios such as petroleum and natural gas, education and skill development, and is considered a prominent face of the BJP in Odisha.

Pradhan is credited for the successful implementation of the PM Ujjwala Yojana during his tenure as the Minister of Petroleum and Natural Gas.

The son of former Union Minister Debendra Pradhan, Dharmendra is known to share close ties with Union Minister Amit Shah. In 2019, when the BJP contested the Assembly polls on its own in Odisha after the alliance with the BJD ended, Pradhan unsuccessfully contested from Pallahara again. He was subsequently nominated twice to the Rajya Sabha.

Returning to direct electoral politics in Odisha in 2024 after 15 years, Pradhan defeated BJD's organisational secretary Pranab

Prakash Das.

ASHWINI VAISHNAW

The former IAS officer-turned-entrepreneur began his political career in June 2018, when he was elected to the Rajya Sabha from Odisha as a BJP nominee despite the party not having the required numbers in the state Assembly. The BJD left the seat for Vaishnaw following PM Narendra Modi's last-minute call to Naveen Patnaik. He was appointed Union Railway Minister three years later.

A native of Jodhpur, Vaishnaw, a qualified engineer from IIT Kanpur, was a 1994-batch IAS officer and served as the Collector of Balasore and Cuttack. He came to the government's notice as a young bureaucrat (then posted as Balasore collector) when he tracked the path of the 1999 Super Cyclone from the US Navy's website and regularly updated the Odisha government. More than 10,000 people perished in the calamity.

After his initial days in Odisha, Vaishnaw was moved to the Prime Minister's Office (PMO) in 2003 and posted as deputy secretary. He also served as the private secretary of former Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee after the BJP lost the 2004 Lok Sabha elections. He was appointed as deputy chairman of the Mormugao Port Authority in 2006.

After quitting IAS, Vaishnaw set up two automotive components manufacturing units in Gujarat during which he is believed to have drawn the attention of Modi, then Gujarat CM.

Promise kept: Suresh Gopi in Modi's cast of ministers

ACTOR-TURNED-politician Suresh Gopi who is the first BJP Lok Sabha MP from Kerala joined PM Narendra Modi's Council of Ministers Sunday.

For Gopi, this is a reward for the promise he made to his electorate in the Thrissur seat. "A Union Minister for Thrissur, Modi's guarantee" was the slogan he deployed at campaign meetings and public interactions, and it adorned the walls of Thrissur in the run-up to the polls.

On Sunday, before leaving for Delhi, Gopi told the media at the Thiruvananthapuram airport: "This (a Cabinet berth) is Modi's decision. He called me and asked me to be at his home at 11.30 am. I am obeying... I will be an MP working for Kerala and Tamil Nadu. I had already told people of Thrissur during the campaign."

Following his win from Thrissur by 74,000 votes, Gopi's Cabinet berth is also another milestone for the party. In the previous NDA governments, the BJP had ministers from Kerala but they were all Rajya Sabha MPs elected from other states. For example, P C Thomas who is the leader of the defunct Indian Federal Democratic Party served as a Union MoS from 2003-04 in

Atal Bihar Vajpayee's government.

Gopi, 65, has only been in the BJP for eight years. But his victory is now a lesson for Kerala BJP, which has been toiling over the years to end the state's bipolar electoral politics between the CPI(M) and the Congress.

A popular Malayalam actor with 250 films under his belt, he was nominated as a Rajya Sabha member in April 2016 by the President under the category of eminent personalities. He joined the BJP just months later in October 2016.

At the time, it was a rarity for film professionals in Kerala to foray into active politics. Gopi, a native of Thiruvananthapuram, soon emerged as the BJP's star campaigner riding on his image as an action movie star known to play police officer roles.

In the 2019 Lok Sabha elections, Gopi made his electoral debut in Thrissur but finished third. The Congress's T P Prathapan won. Gopi had by this point managed to reach out to the Hindu community in Kerala over the Sabarimala issue. Although he lost, Gopi managed to increase BJP's vote share to



After assist to BJP in state, Kumaraswamy debuts at Centre

ONCE DUBBED the "accidental CM" by Karnataka BJP, Mandya MP and JD(S) state chief H D Kumaraswamy was among the ministers in the third Narendra Modi-led NDA government. This is the first time Kumaraswamy will be a Central government minister.

Known for his pro-farmer stance and often criticised for his lack of ideological commitment, Kumaraswamy's rise in politics is largely attributed to his father and former PM H D Deve Gowda. The two-time Karnataka CM played a prominent role in the impressive performance of the BJP-JD(S) coalition in south Karnataka, where it won 12 of the 14 seats. The strong showing by the JD(S) helped the BJP hold ground in a lot of areas and it ended up winning 17 seats while the Congress bagged 9, much lower than what it had expected.

The youngest son of Gowda and viewed as his political heir, Kumaraswamy is the only leader in Karnataka to have allied with both the BJP and the Congress to become the CM.

His first tenure as CM was in 2006, after he along with 42 JD(S) legislators withdrew support from the N Dharam Singh-led Congress-JD(S) coalition government. Kumaraswamy then allied with the BJP to form the "20-20" government, where the two parties entered a power-sharing agreement of 20 months each – an agreement the JD(S) leader later reneged on.

The first time Kumaraswamy became the CM was also the first time he was elected as an MLA. After registering his first win in the 1996 Lok Sabha polls, he lost the next three elections – two Lok Sabha and one Assembly election – before winning the 2004 Assembly polls. Since then, the three-time MP and five-time MLA has lost only one of the six elections he has contested to cement his position as one of the

tallest Vokkaliga leaders in the state.

His second stint as CM was the short-lived coalition with Congress in 2018, when the government lasted little more than a year and collapsed after the controversial "Operation Lotus" orchestrated by the BJP. In his first term, Kumaraswamy gained acclaim for banning single number lottery in the state. The farm loan waiver of Rs around Rs 34,000 crore benefiting around 17 lakh farmers was the major announcement during his second tenure.

"I am not pushing for any Cabinet berth. If I get Agriculture, I will be happy as I am interested in the sector from the beginning," Kumaraswamy told reporters in Delhi on Sunday. The JD(S) leader's tenure as Union Minister is expected to boost the regional party that suffered its worst drubbing in recent years in last year's Assembly polls, where it could win only 19 seats and lost in some of its strongholds, raising serious concerns about its future.

The tide turned in this year's Lok Sabha polls when the JD(S) succeeded in rallying its vote base behind the coalition. The party won two of the three seats it contested and helped the BJP win at least eight constituencies where it has a strong presence.

His grip over the party unit, especially after the waning influence of Deve Gowda, has attracted a lot of criticism as many JD(S) leaders resigned from the party after he assumed charge. S R Srinivas who quit the JD(S) in 2023, accused Kumaraswamy of running the party as a business enterprise.

‘As CM, I must take full responsibility for (Manipur) loss in Lok Sabha polls’

IN HIS first interview since facing a significant electoral loss in the Lok Sabha elections, Manipur CM N BIREN SINGH spoke to RITIKA CHOPRA about why he feels the BJP lost to Congress in the state, what needs to change in the future, and whether the changed equations within the NDA would affect the Centre's approach towards him and his government in the state. Edited excerpts:

This was the first election since the violence in Manipur. What do you think of the message by the voters?

In the last year, due to the complexity of the violence, neither the state nor Central government has been able to take strong actions against the groups on both sides. This has led to dissatisfaction among the valley people with both governments (in the state and at the Centre). Although law and order is a state issue, the Central forces play a key role here,

yet we are not meeting public expectations. This is why we lost in the valley. In the outer areas, similar sentiments exist. Resolving the issues in Manipur is complex, many don't understand the core

problems. Identifying and addressing these core issues is key to solving the violence.

Isn't this a verdict against you? Why not? As CM, I must take full responsibility. Some agencies see this (the violence) as a fight between two ethnic communities, but I don't. We began identifying and deporting illegal migrants, launched a war on drugs in 2018, destroying poppy plantations. Indigenous tribes are our citizens, but somebody is trying to misinterpret that we are against them. This sparked the violence.

You are referring to 'somebody' and outsiders, but vote was cast by the citizens...

They (outsiders) have injected venom and instigated the Kukis to strike against the Meiteis. The valley people were endorsing the actions of the government.
