56 killed in stampede on soccer pitch

Clashes erupt as fans protest refereeing at a soccer match in West Africa's Guinea

CONAKRY (Guinea), Dec 2: Fifty-six people were killed and several injured in a stampede at a soccer stadium in southern Guinea, following clashes between fans, Guinea's government said on Monday.

Authorities are conducting an investigation to establish those responsible for the stampede on Sunday, Communications Minister Fana Soumah said in a statement read on national television.

Among the victims are several children according to local media and a coalition of political parties.

The stampede broke out on Sunday afternoon at the stadium in the city of Nzerekore during the final of a local tournament between the Labe and Nzerekore teams in honour of Guinea's military leader, Mama-

di Doumbouya, Guinea's Prime Minister Amadou Oury Bah said on the X platform. Local media reported that security forces tried to use tear gas to restore calm after the chaos that followed a disputed penalty. "This (the disputed penalty) angered supporters who threw stones. This is how the security services used tear gas," Media Guinea, a local news website, reported. It said several of those killed were children, while some of the injured being treated at hospital are in critical condition.

Videos that appeared to be from the scene showed fans in a section of the stadium shouting and protesting the refereeing before clashes broke out as people poured onto the field. People were running as they tried to escape from the stadium, many of them jumping the high fence.

Videos also showed many people lying on the floor in what looked like a hospital as a crowd gathered nearby, some assisting the wounded.

Parliament logjam ends

Constitution debate to be held in LS, RS

NEW DELHI, Dec 2: The Government and Opposition parties reached an agreement on Monday to break the week-long impasse in Parliament with the dates announced for a discussion on the Constitution, to mark its 75th year of adoption, in the Lok Sabha and the Rajya Sabha.

The Lower House will take up the discussion on the Constitution on December 13 and 14, and the Upper House on December 16 and 17, Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju said following a meeting Speaker Om Birla held with floor leaders of different parties.

Opposition parties had demanded discussions in both Houses of Parliament to mark the 75th anniversary of the adoption of the Constitution by the Constituent Assembly.

Rijiju told reporters that all parties have agreed to allow Parliament to function from Tuesday, and both Houses will take up their listed agenda items. He expressed confidence that Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha will function smoothly from Tuesday.

Following back-channel talks, the breakthrough was achieved at the meeting chaired by Birla and attended by Gaurav Gogoi of the

Congress, DMK's T R Baalu and TMC's Kalyan Banerjee among others besides Rijiju and his deputy in the ministry Arjun Ram Meghwal.

Several Opposition leaders, who attended the meeting, also echoed Rijiju's views about Parliament functioning smoothly from Tuesday.

Asked about other issues being raised by the Opposition such as the Sambhal violence and the unrest in Manipur, Rijiju said Birla has made it clear that any matter can be raised in line with the rules while requesting parties to allow Parliament to function smoothly.

Sources said the Samajwa-

di Party may be allowed to raise the Sambhal issue and the TMC the events in Bangladesh following the deposition of the Sheikh Hasina government.

The Congress has been persistent in raising the issue of indictment by US prosecutors of Adani Group chairperson Gautam Adani and other company officials on bribery and fraud charges. This coupled with vociferous Opposition protests over matters such as the Sambhal violence and Manipur unrest have resulted in constant adjournments of the Lok Sabha and the Rajya Sabha since the Winter Session began on November 25. - PTI

Police finally crack Nagaon murder case

Anupam murdered three of Sarkar family before being killed in a scuffle with another member

NAGAON, Dec 2: Police finally cracked last November's sensational murder case of Garajan Pashim Amarakanda village under Garajan police outpost of Nagaon district in which four bodies were found inside a residence.

Addressing a press conference here on Monday, Nagaon SP Swapnil Dekha informed that the murder episode unfolded following in-

terrogation of a person, Amal Sarkar, who has been arrested in this connection. Incidentally, Amal Sarkar is the nephew of one of the victims Gangadhar Sarkar whose body along with those of his wife Sarudhari Sarkar and younger daughter Jayasmita Sarkar was found inside their residence. Alongside these bodies lay the body of the fourth victim Anupam Sutradhar.

The Nagaon superintendent of police said, as per the

statement of Amal Sarkar, it was Anupam Sutradhar who had killed the three members of the Sarkar family.

When Amal entered the room where the gruesome murder took place, he tried to catch hold of the youth. But a "ferocious" Anupam leapt onto Amal and in the ensuing scuffle, the former got killed on the spot, leaving the latter with minor injury.

India takes up matter of atrocities on Hindus with Bangladesh

GUWAHATI, Dec 2: Prime Minister Narendra Modi has taken serious note of the atrocities on Hindu people in Bangladesh and India has taken up the issue with the Government of Bangladesh as well as in the international forum.

Sources in the Prime Minister's Office (PMO) told *The Assam Tribune* that the Prime Minister is very much concerned over the situation. Modi had a telephone discussion with the President of the United States of America on the issue. Both the leaders are of the view that early restoration of normalcy in Bangladesh is

important and the interim Government should ensure the safety and security of the minorities, particularly Hindus living in Bangladesh.

Sources said that as soon as the interim Government in Bangladesh took over, Modi spoke to the head of the interim Government Md Yunus and raised the issue of the safety of the minorities. Yunus had promised to take steps to ensure the safety of the minorities, but so far, he has not been able to keep his promise. Incidents of attacks on Hindus are taking place in Bangladesh regularly and the

situation aggravated after the arrest of an ISKCON leader in that country. On its part, the Ministry of External Affairs has also requested the Bangladesh Government to ensure the safety and security of the Hindus and other minority communities. The MEA also requested the Bangladesh government to ensure the protection of the places of religious worship of the people belonging to the minority communities.

It may be mentioned here that the minority communities are at the receiving end since the Sheikh Hasina

regime was ousted and a caretaker Government headed by Nobel Laureate Md Yunus took over as the caretaker Government. However, this was not the first instance of the minorities facing problems in Bangladesh and only the Awami League Government tried to give some kind of protection to the minority communities, particularly the Hindus.

According to the records available, the Hindu population in Bangladesh is dwindling very fast. At the time of the partition of the country, the Hindu population in erstwhile East Pakistan was around 30 per cent and now the Hindu population in Bangladesh is only around 7.95 per cent.

PM to attend Assam investment summit

NEW DELHI, Dec 2: Prime Minister Narendra Modi will attend the Assam Investor and Infrastructure Summit scheduled to take place in Guwahati on February 24 and 25 next year.

The announcement was made after Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma on Monday called on Prime Minister Modi at his official chamber here.

Sarma discussed some of the critical infrastructure and development projects of the State with the Prime Minister.

A senior official privy to the meeting said that during the 25-minute long meeting, Sarma apprised the Prime Minister about the slew of development initiatives in Assam.

According to the official, the discussion took place on the Kaziranga elevated corridor project, the status of work of the East-West Corridor from Harangajao to Silchar and the stretch of NH from Jorhat to Dibrugarh.

Sarma landed in the national capital on Sunday night. During the day on Monday, Sarma also met the Union Minister for Jal Shakti CR Patil and discussed the 100 per cent implementation of the Har Ghar Jal mission in the State.

Sarma informed Patil that Assam is vigorously implementing the Prime Minister's vision of Har Ghar Jal and the State has so far achieved over 80 per cent of the tap water connection target.

Union Minister of State for External Affairs, Pabitra Margherita, Chief Secretary Dr Ravi Kota and senior officials from the Ministry of Jal Shakti were present during the discussions.

1.25 lakh hectares of rubber plantation completed in NE

GUWAHATI, Dec 2: Under the project INROAD (Indian Natural Rubber Operations for Assisted Development) funded by four top tyre companies, an area of 1.25,272 hectares have been covered under new rubber plantation across 94 districts in Northeast and parts of West Bengal, in what is said to be one of the highest natural rubber plantations ever achieved in the country in four years.

Of the total target of 43,000 hectares in Assam, 37,000 hectares have been achieved. The current rubber production in the Northeast is around 1.2 lakh metric tonnes

and the project INROAD aims to double it in the next eight to ten years.

Project INROAD entails the development of 200,000 hectares of rubber plantation in the Northeastern states and West Bengal. It is being financially supported by four members of the Automotive Tyre Manufacturers Association (ATMA) including Apollo, Ceat, JK and MRF and implemented by the Rubber Board of India.

The tyre companies are pumping in Rs 1,100 crore for the project, of which Rs 1,000 crore will be for plantation and the rest for skill development of farmers and building modern smokehouses. INROAD

is a landmark initiative and the first of its kind in the world where the tyre industry is contributing directly towards the development of rubber plantations.

"We are targeting around 2.5 lakh farmers in the region. The share of North East in India's area under rubber plantation before the launch of the INROAD project was 23 per cent. Once the objective of developing plantations in an additional 2 lakh hectares under the INROAD project is achieved, it is estimated that the share of NE states will increase to 38 per cent. Similarly, the share of North East in India's natural rubber production will go up from 16 per

cent currently to 32 per cent," an official told *The Assam Tribune*.

"Notwithstanding challenges, nearly 90 per cent of the plantation target for the first four years under project INROAD has been achieved. Beyond expanding planting areas, the project has seen significant progress in strengthening local nurseries, and building grower capacities, a testament to the collaborative efforts among tyre companies and the Rubber Board of India", said Rajiv Budhraj, Director General, Automotive Tyre Manufacturers Association.

Centre entrusts RRU to tackle drug smuggling in Northeast

PASIGHAT, Dec 2: The Centre has tasked the Rashtriya Raksha University (RRU) here with conducting research in pharmacology and toxicology with a focus on analysing the societal impact of illegal drugs in the country's northeastern region, an official said on Monday.

This initiative, led by the Ministry of Home Affairs, aims to enhance national security through in-depth studies on narcotics trafficking, regional drug issues and community engagement, the official added.

"The newly established Centre for Narcotics and Drug Studies (CNDS) will conduct cutting-edge research in pharmacology and toxicology, with a focus on analysing the production, availability, and societal impact of illegal drugs in the region," said Avinash Kharel, director of the Pasighat campus of RRU, told PTI.

The CNDS will begin operations next year and has been tasked with preparing a cadre of highly skilled professionals to address complex security challenges.

"Once the centre is fully operational at the Pasighat campus, the university will approach the State government to sign memorandums of understanding (MoUs) and express interest in training security forces in this domain," Kharel added.

Sanjeev, assistant professor in the Police Administration department, explained that key objectives of the CNDS include developing effective strategies to combat drug

abuse, improving public health outcomes and fostering collaboration with educational institutions, government agencies, and industries.

Through specialised training programmes, the centre aims to empower students, researchers, and professionals with the expertise needed to tackle the growing threat of narcotics, he said.

Given Arunachal Pradesh's proximity to trafficking routes and the unique challenges of the Northeast, this initiative is expected to significantly strengthen cross-border monitoring and drug control measures, he added.

Additionally, the centre will support the formulation of effective laws and policies to prevent illegal drug trafficking and abuse.

Sachin Chauhan, assistant professor (Police Administration), noted that this effort aligns with RRU's broader mission to enhance national security, with cybercrime and policing emerging as additional focus areas.

By integrating research, education, and community collaboration, the Pasighat campus aims to build a robust framework to combat drug-related issues, ensuring a healthier and safer society, Chauhan said.

Currently, the Police Administration department at the campus has trained 576 participants across various domains.

The campus, which began operations in 2022, is in its early stages and plans to move to a permanent location in the coming years. — PTI

Over 19,000 acres of illegal poppy cultivation destroyed in Manipur since 2017

IMPHAL, Dec 2: The Manipur government has destroyed a total of 19,135.6 acres of illegal poppy cultivation in at least 12 districts since 2017, according to an official report.

In Kangpokpi district, the highest of 4,454.4 acres were destroyed during the period, followed by 3,348 acres in Ukhrul and 2,713.8 acres in Churachandpur; the study — Mapping and Estimation of Opium Poppy Cultivation Area using Remote Sensing and GIS

Technology — revealed. The exercise was conducted by the Manipur Remote Sensing Applications Centre under the Planning department, based on data provided by the 'Narcotics and Affairs of Border wing of the State police.

The other districts where illegal poppy cultivation was destroyed include 2,575 acres in Tengnoupal, 1,982.5 acres in Chandel and 1,682 acres in Senapati, the report said.

It showed that the area under poppy cultivation in nine districts in 2021-22 was 28,598.91 acres, which declined to 11,288.1 acres in 2023-24.

Between 2023 and 2024, poppy cultivation decreased by 32.13 per cent compared to 2022-23, according to the study.

In a post on X, Chief Minister N Biren Singh had last month said the State government is committed to eradicating illegal poppy cultivation in the northeastern state. — PTI

Hundreds take out rally against attacks on Hindus in Bangladesh

AGARTALA, Dec 2: Hundreds of Hindus belonging to Hindu Sangharsha Samity, staged a protest demonstration before the Bangladesh visa office here on Monday against the oppression of Hindus in the neighbouring country. They also torched the flag hoisted before the office.

They were demanding the immediate stopping of the oppression of Hindus in Bangladesh, the stopping of the destruction of temples, the immediate release of Chinmoy Krishna Das, who was arrested by police and the resignation of the Chief Adviser of the interim Bangladesh government, Muhammad Yunus.

Meanwhile, two groups from Hindu Sangharsha Samity (HSS), a wing of Rashtriya Swayam Sevak Sangha

(RSS) and Yuva Congress, the youth wing of Congress, demonstrated before the Agartala check post.

BJP vice-president Subal Bhowmick alleged that the situation of Hindus in Bangladesh is unprecedented. "We demand that the Nobel Prize given to Md Yunus should be taken back. Bangladesh government should immediately stop that oppression on Hindus living there," Bhowmick said.

Lease period of government land doubled in Meghalaya

SHILLONG, Dec 2: The Meghalaya government today doubled the lease period of government land from 30 to 60 years to attract large investors into the State.

The decision to increase the lease period was taken at a Cabinet meeting after it was observed that the Return on Investment (RoI) on a large project with a 30-year lease period is a concern. Taking into consideration the apprehension of investors for large investments, the lease period was increased.

Government spokesperson and Cabinet Minister Paul Lyngdoh, said, "For example, the Orchid Polo, which is a joint venture project, the proposed investment is about Rs 300 crore. So in such cases, investors would naturally be apprehensive that their RoI may not materialise in 30 years. If after the expiry of the lease period, for any unforeseen reasons,

the lease is not renewed then the investor would make a loss on the investment and also discourage other big investors to the State."

Lyngdoh said the Department of Revenue and Disaster Management has proposed to double the lease period and the Cabinet approved it. He further informed that at the end of the lease period of 60 years, the lease would be extended by another 30 years.

Meanwhile, Lyngdoh, who also holds the Social Welfare portfolio, said the State government would establish 15-

20 new rehabilitation centres by 2025 for drug users. The government currently is funding nine centres owned and run by private institutions. "It is also partially or fully supporting several church-based centres," he said.

He further said that due to a shortage of such centres, many families are forced to send their loved ones to centres outside the State.

Recently two persons namely Rickelson Jyrwa and Meban Syndor died under mysterious circumstances in two rehabilitation centres in Assam. One such case was also reported earlier this year in a different rehabilitation centre in Assam.

Lyngdoh said the Meghalaya government has sought a report on the recent deaths from the Assam government. He said the government has written to the Assam government and the Deputy Commissioner of East Khasi Hills has also sought a report from her Assam counterpart, Lyngdoh informed.

ITANAGAR, Dec 2: A minor girl, aged 11, who was kidnapped from Assam's Karbi Anglong district, was rescued in a joint operation conducted by the police forces of Arunachal Pradesh and Assam.

"Police also arrested a couple, identified as Bheta Chakma (45) and Menaki Chakma, residents of Karbi Anglong, for kidnapping the girl," Naharlagun SP Mihin Gambo said today.

In a statement, the SP said that on November 30, a joint operation by Naharlagun police and Assam police led to the safe rescue of an 11-year-old girl from A-Sector, Naharlagun.

The girl was abducted last month from Khatkhathi in Assam and a case was registered.

The SP said that the police today apprehended the two accused, who are husband and wife.

The rescued girl and the apprehended accused have been handed over to Assam police for further legal action.
