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Deadlock continues over appointment of new rawal at Kedar

Dehradun: The deadlock over the appointment of a new rawal (chief priest) of Kedarnath temple continues more than a month after the incumbent priest, Bhimshankar Ling, 70, expressed his desire to retire citing health concerns and proposed his disciple, Shivacharya Shanti Ling (also known as Kedar Ling), as his successor. Badrinath Kedarnath Temple Committee (BKTC), however, maintained that the rawal does not have the authority to appoint his successor, leading to a prolonged impasse.

The situation has been further complicated by a recent controversy involving the rawal taking the sacred 'Roop Chhad' (ceremonial stick) outside the temple premises to an event in Nanded, Maharashtra, drawing strong objections from temple purohits (temple priests). The act has been criticised as a violation of long-standing traditions, which mandate the stick must remain within the shrine. Following objections, a notice has been issued to the rawal seeking an expla-

nation. Investigation is underway at both govt and committee levels, sources said.

In a related development, BKTC chief executive officer Vijay Prasad Thapliyal, who had authorised the ceremonial object's movement, was removed from his position late Tuesday and sent back to his parent department, Krishi Mandi Samiti. Earlier that day, state tourism department formally cancelled Thapliyal's deputation as CEO, a post he had held since July 29, 2024, and relieved him ahead of Char Dham yatra.

BKTC chairman Hemant Dwivedi said, "A new rawal is appointed based on recommendations of the committee and a screening panel, which are constituted only after current rawal submits a retirement proposal—something we have not yet received," he said, citing BKTC Act, 1938.

As per tradition, only a member of the Veerashaiva community from Karanataka can be appointed as the rawal of Kedarnath. The position requires the priest to remain unmarried, be a devoted follower of Lord Shiva, and oversee all major religious rituals at the shrine.

Student 'grooms' minors into ISIS module, held

FIR Registered Under BNS, UAPA In Lucknow

Lucknow: UP Anti-Terrorism Squad has arrested a 19-year-old BDS student for allegedly running an ISIS-linked online radicalisation and recruitment module targeting minors; officials said Wednesday.

Investigators alleged the Saharanpur resident, taken into custody in Moradabad on March 16, had come under influence of ISIS terrorist ideology nearly three years ago and later established contact with handlers based in Pakistan and other foreign locations.

A case has been registered under provisions of BNS

and UAPA in Gomtinagar. A probe is on to identify members and map the network.

Officials alleged the student used Instagram along with encrypted platforms such as Session and Discord to identify teenagers engaging with religious or identity-driven content. He allegedly initiated conversations, built trust and gradually steered them toward extremist views through a calibrated indoctrination strategy.

ATS officials alleged he operated multiple anonymous accounts using VPN servi-

ces to evade detection and circulated ISIS propaganda, including online magazines, execution videos and speeches by extremist preachers.

One such platform, allegedly titled "Al Hithad Media Foundation", was used to widen outreach and attract recruits from across the country. Investigators claimed he also motivated members to support Jihad and, in some cases, discussed possibility of fifteen-style attacks.

Authorities are closely monitoring online activities of students after several doctors from J&K and UP were arrested for allegedly operating a Jalsh-e-Mohammed "white-collar" terrorist module linked to a network busted in Faridabad before the Nov 10 New Delhi car blast. These doctors allegedly got indoctrinated through online content and encrypted channels.

Man kills 35yo bro in Mathura; case filed

Agra: A 35-year-old man was allegedly murdered by his elder brother following a domestic dispute in Saunikh area of Mathura district late Tuesday night, police said. The incident took place in Ahmal village under Magor police station limits.

Meghshyam Singh allegedly attacked his younger brother, Niranjan Singh alias Nahna, with a sharp-edged gandasa (cleaver), resulting in his death. He later fled with his wife, Durgash.

Police said the wives of the two brothers are sisters. Tensions escalated on Tuesday night when Niranjan's sister-in-law allegedly accused him of casting an inappropriate gaze at her, triggering a heated argument. The altercation soon turned violent, with Meghshyam allegedly attacking Niranjan with cleaver. A case has been filed against the accused couple under BNS section 103 (murder). Police have sent the body for postmortem.

"Efforts are on to arrest both accused," DSP Anil Kumar Singh said.

'Accessibility-first' campus for disabled kids now in Doon

Dehradun: In a bid to create a more inclusive learning environment, Latika, formerly the Latika Roy Foundation, a Dehradun-based nonprofit, has opened a "first-of-its-kind" campus designed with accessibility for children with disabilities at its core.

Built on sustainable design principles, the campus uses local materials and craftsmanship along with low maintenance, energy-efficient construction techniques, making it environmentally responsible and easy to maintain. Spread over 58,000 sq ft, the facility caters to around 1,500 children aged 7 to 14 with physical and developmental needs, offering education and life skills training.

As per experts, educational infrastructure designed entirely around accessibility remains limited. The new Latika campus seeks to address this gap by embedding universal design principles into its architecture from the outset. A parent said the facility integrates accessibility at

every level, with a multi-storey ramp system, barrier-free circulation, inclusive classrooms, therapy spaces, and family support areas.

Officials from Cushman & Wakefield, which provided CSR seed funding and pro bono project management support, said each element has been designed to ensure safe mobility, learning, and participation. Jo Chopra, founder and executive director of Latika, said, "The initiative reflects the belief that every child deserves to grow up in an environment where they are valued and can participate fully in community life."

Anshul Jam, chief executive (India office and retail) at Cushman & Wakefield, said, "Embedding accessibility into infrastructure enables children with disabilities to learn and grow confidently."
