SC-appointed panel wants MSP buys capped, limited to rice and wheat

Procurement of crops at declared MSP can be the prerogative of the states, the panel says

THE SUPREME COURT-APPOINTED committee, which reviewed the now-repealed three controversial farm laws, has called for an end to open-ended procurement of agricultural crops by capping rice and wheat purchases at minimum support price (MSP) and creation of a price stabilisation fund for other key crops instead of MSP support.

The three-member committee also recommended that mandi fees charged by Agricultural Produce Marketing Committees (APMCs) be withdrawn to reduce the cost of purchases by traders and enable farmers to fetch higher returns.

Procurement of crops at declared MSP can be the prerogative of the states, the committee said.

Farmers, who protested against farm laws for over a year on the Delhi borders, had demanded strengthening of the MSP system with statutory backing. The Narendra Modi government, which repealed the laws amid the agitation, has made it clear the MSP system

will continue.

The panel has also urged the government to either abolish or substantially dilute the Essential Commodities Act to facilitate a free market and avoid stiff stock holding limits.

Releasing the report on Monday, Anil Ghawat, president of the Maharashtra-based Shetkari Sanghatana and a member of the panel, said the committee found that more than 86% of 73 farmers' organisations representing around 3.8 crore farmers supported the farm laws, which had sought to redefine the rules for marketing of agricultural produce to improve farmers' access to

markets. The panel had submitted its report to the Supreme Court a year ago. The report stressed the view held by many leading agricultural economists that the laws were aimed at creating an ecosystem to facilitate private investment in well-oiled supply chains to cut down on logistics costs, buttress value addition and reduce food losses.

According to the panel, the price triggers for imposition of stock holding limits for perishables and non-perishables should be 200% and 75% respectively, so that markets are not disturbed without a valid reason. The repealed law that sought to amend the EC Act had

proposed limits of 100% and 50%, respectively, for perishables and non-perishables. Currently, these limits are prescribed as ad hoc policy response to the market situations. The panel said a price stabilisation fund would address extreme price fluctuations if any in commodities such as nutriceals, pulses, oilseeds and even onion and potatoes.

The panel, which also consisted of Ashok Gulati, former chairman, Commission for Agricultural Costs and Prices (CACP), and Pramod Kumar Joshi, former director- South Asia, International Food Policy Research Institute, said: "The terms of ref-

erence for CACP can be expanded to collate, analyse and disseminate price information — both domestic and international, with a view to facilitate efficient price discovery — both spot and futures." CACP currently recommends MSPs for 23 agricultural commodities such as cereals, pulses, oilseed and cotton to the government. It suggested a compensation fund for the next three to five years in case of loss of revenue due to abolition of APMC taxes to states.

Punjab and Haryana impose sundry levies such as mandi tax, rural development cess and artha commission at 8.5% and 6.5% on cereals purchased in the APMC mandis, while other states such as Madhya Pradesh and Rajasthan have a levy structure in range of 3-5%.

Currently, the FCI buys around 35% of the total production of rice and wheat at MSP rates. The three farm laws — Farmers (Empowerment and Protection) Agreement on Price Assurance and Farm Services Act, 2020; the Farmers' Produce Trade and Commerce (Promotion and Facilitation) Act, 2020; and the Essential Commodities (Amendment) Act, 2020 — were passed by Parliament in September 2020. Following prolonged protests by a section of the farmers' community, the Parliament passed the Farm Laws Repeal Bill on November 30, 2021, to annul them.

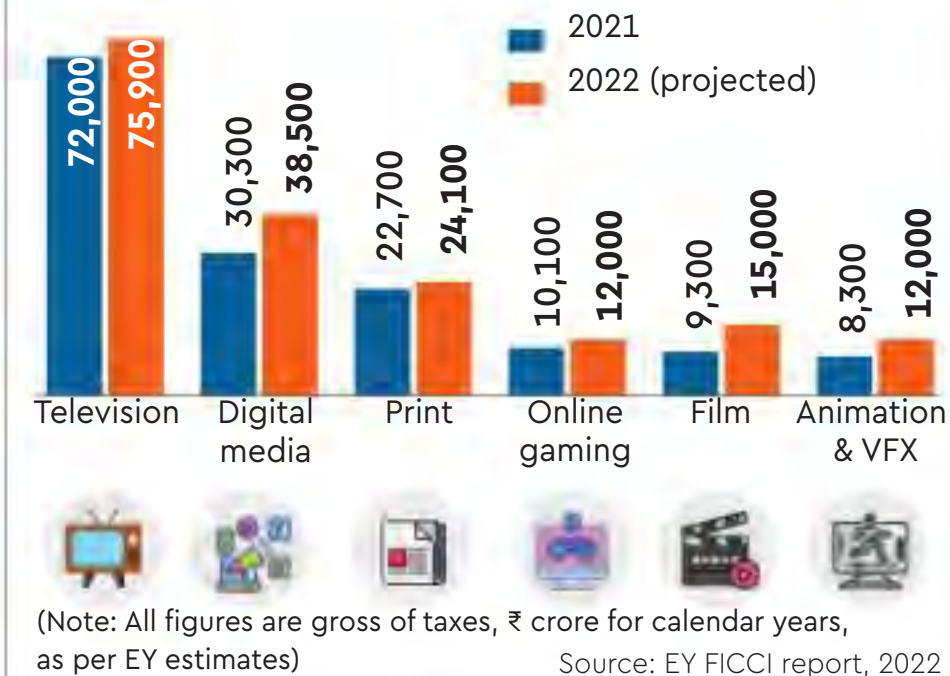
INDIA'S M&E (MEDIA and entertainment) sector grew by 16.4% in CY 2021, to reach a total of ₹1.61 trillion, according to the FICCI-EY report, Tuning into consumer — Indian M&E rebounds with a customer-centric approach. The sector is also expected to recover to pre-pandemic levels this year, and to reach an estimated ₹1.89 trillion in CY 2022, assuming the pandemic doesn't create further disruption. In 2021, the M&E sector had seen an 11% decline from 2019 levels, which was largely on account of the second Covid-19 wave that affected the April to June quarter.

In 2020, the first pandemic year, the industry saw a 24% decline to reach ₹1.38 trillion, with its revenues plunging to 2017 levels. This year is not just expected to see the segment surpass 2019, but going by its recovery in 2021, the report also estimates that it will grow at a CAGR of 11% to reach ₹2.32 trillion in 2024.

Advertising revenue too recovered in 2021, stopping short of 2019 levels by 6% to reach ₹74,600 crore. TV advertising registered the highest growth in ad revenue to reach ₹31,300 crore and was followed by digital that saw a 29% increase to clock ₹24,600 crore. Print, which saw its fair share of challenges in 2020, took the third place at ₹15,100 crore. The three sectors together accounted for 95% of the total ad spends last year with TV taking the lion's share at 42%

while digital and print claimed 33% and 20% of the share, respectively. The report also notes that India's advertising revenue grew by 25% last year, and is estimated to reach ₹1 trillion by 2024.

While TV advertising revenues grew, 2021 saw the segment record a 6.2% decline in TV subscription revenues. This is the second year in a row that TV

has recorded a decline in subscription revenues, and the fall is attributed to a reduction of 6 million pay TV homes. Connected TV sets in the country have now reached the 10 million mark and the report estimates that smart connected TVs will surpass 40 million by 2025, bringing to an end the monopoly of broadcasters on the TV screen.

Expedite decision on raw petro coke allocation, Supreme Court tells DGFT

THE SUPREME COURT on Monday asked the Directorate General of Foreign Trade (DGFT) to decide expeditiously on the allocation of imported raw petroleum coke (RPC) to all eligible calciners for 2022-23 within 10 days of receipt of their applications, taking note of the precarious situation in which the industry is placed.

In October 2018, the SC put a cap on RPC imports and allowed import of 1.4 million MT RPC per annum by the calcining industry. It had permitted the domestic aluminium industry to use up to 0.5 million tonne of imported calcined petroleum coke (CPC) per year. Since then, the DGFT had been allocating 1.4 million MT of RPC quota to eligible calciners on the basis of their production capacity.

A bench led by Justice LN Rao has sought a response from the DGFT on various applications, including one by Sanvira Industries. The applications have sought direction for a refund of the quota of non-imported RPC of FY 2020-21, amounting to 2,13,229 tonne, to calciners who had surrendered their respective quotas in 2020-21 and/or who were penalised in FY22 to the extent of the quantity surrendered or penalised. They want such calciners to be allowed to import RPC against such quota within a period of three months.

Rain CII Carbon (Vizag), through its senior counsel AM Singvi, also asked the SC to direct DGFT to allocate the remaining/ non-imported RPC

to all eligible calciners on a pro rata basis in 2021-22 based on plant capacity and also carry forward the remaining/ non-imported quantum of RPC of 2020-21 to 2021-22.

It said CPC is an essential raw material in the anodes required during the electrolytic process of aluminium production. The company said non-availability of RPC import quota had induced a forced shutdown of its plant in Visakhapatnam.

Senior counsel KV Vishwanathan, appearing for Sanvira, opposed Rain CII's plea, saying Rain cannot get more RPC quota than it is eligible for to the detriment of other calciners who had surrendered the non-imported quota or for which they were penalised in FY22 by the DGFT. It wanted reimbursement of the non-imported/

Govt mulls Covid booster shots for all above 18 years

NEW DELHI : The government is considering allowing booster dose of Covid vaccine for all those above 18 years in view of a surge in infections in parts of the world and ease difficulties faced during international travel, sources said on Monday.

Currently, healthcare and frontline workers and those aged above 60 years are being administered precaution doses.

All the people aged above 60 have been made eligible for the precaution dose of Covid vaccine after the Union Health Ministry removed the comorbidity clause recently.

The prioritisation and sequencing of the dose would be based on the completion of nine months to 39 weeks from the date of administration of the second dose.

"The government is con-



sidering to allow booster dose of Covid vaccine to all those above 18 years in view of a surge in infections in parts of the world and ease difficulties faced during international travel," a source said.

India began COVID-19 vaccination for children in the age group of 12-14 years from March 16 this year.

The countrywide vaccination drive was rolled out on January 16, 2021, with the healthcare workers getting inoculated in the first phase. Vaccination of the frontline workers started from February 2 last year.

The next phase of COVID-19 vaccination commenced on March 1 last year for peo-

ple over 60 years of age and those aged 45 and above with specified co-morbid conditions.

India launched vaccination for all people aged more than 45 years from April 1 last year.

The government then decided to expand its vaccination drive by allowing everyone above 18 years of age to be inoculated against the viral disease from May 1 last year.

The next phase of Covid vaccination commenced from January 3 this year for adolescents in the age group of 15-18 years.

India began administering precaution doses of the vaccines to the healthcare and frontline workers and those aged 60 and above with comorbidities from January 10 this year.

Rajya Sabha returns Appropriation Bills to Lok Sabha

NEW DELHI : Rajya Sabha on Monday returned a money bill moved by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, authorising the government for payment and appropriation of certain sums from the consolidated fund for the financial year 2021-22.

The Upper House of Parliament also returned another Appropriation Bill for the expenditure done in the 2018-19 financial year.

Both the Appropriation Bills were passed by Lok Sabha earlier.

Rajya Sabha discussed the Appropriation (No.3) Bill, 2022, which seeks to authorise payment of certain additional sums from the consolidated fund of India for services of 2021-22, and the Appropriation (No.2) Bill, 2022 for services during 2018-19 before returning them to Lok Sabha.

Odisha gets major share of NABARD's rural-infra funds

BHUBANESWAR : The National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development said on Monday that it has sanctioned a financial assistance of more than Rs 4,000 crore to Odisha in the current fiscal, the highest allocation in the country.

The allotment was made on the basis of the priority accorded by the state government for developing of infrastructure regarding drinking water supply, irrigation and rural connectivity. NABARD said in a press release.

The projects are expected to play a key role in supporting the rural economy by

improving the livelihoods of people, the release said.

An amount of 4,013 crore was sanctioned under the Rural Infrastructure Development Fund (RIDF) during the 2021-22 financial year, out of which Rs 2,568 crore was for construction of rural roads and bridges.

More than 10 lakh people in the state will benefit from the creation or upgradation of 2000 km of roads and bridges spanning a length of 17.13 km, it said.

Nine mega piped water supply projects got Rs 840 crore for providing clean, treated and safe drinking

water at the doorsteps of around 17 lakh rural population across the state.

Financial assistance of Rs 605 crore has also been extended for infrastructure development in the allied and irrigation sector. It includes the Kusumi irrigation project and the livestock vaccine production unit, as well as cluster lift irrigation and flood protection projects.

The total sanction has crossed Rs 32,100 crore for Odisha since the inception of the RIDF, the release added.

BJP's Pramod Sawant to continue as Goa CM



PANAJI : Pramod Sawant was on Monday unanimously elected the leader of the BJP legislature party in Goa, paving the way for him to take over as the chief minister for a second term.

Sawant's name for the top post was cleared at a meeting of the newly elected BJP MLAs and senior party leaders in Panaji in the evening.

The meeting was also attended by BJP central observers Narendra Singh Tomar and L Murugan, Assembly poll in-charge Devendra Fadnavis and the party's state unit president, Sadanand Shet Tanavade.

It has been decided that Dr Pramod Sawant would be

the leader of the House, Tomar told reporters after the meeting.

Tomar said MLA Vishwajit Rane proposed Sawant's name as the leader of the BJP legislature party. His proposal was seconded by other MLAs, including Mauvin Godinho and Rohan Khaunte.

Tomar said Sawant's election was unanimous. He said the party will now stake a claim to form the next government in Goa.

The BJP won 20 seats, just one short of majority in the 40-member Assembly, in the February 14 polls. It has received support from two MLAs of the MGP and three Independent legislators.

Senior Congress leader Ghulam Nabi Azad receives Padma Bhushan award in the field of Public Affairs



NEW DELHI : Senior Congress leader Ghulam Nabi Azad on Monday received the Padma Bhushan award in the field of Public Affairs.

He received the award from President Ram Nath Kovind today. Padma Awards, one of the highest civilian Awards of the country, are conferred in three categories, namely, Padma Vibhushan, Padma Bhushan and Padma Shri.

The Awards are given in various disciplines/ fields of

activities, viz.- art, social work, public affairs, science and engineering, trade and industry, medicine, literature and education, sports, civil service, etc. 'Padma Vibhushan' is awarded for exceptional and distinguished service; 'Padma Bhushan' for distinguished service of high order and 'Padma Shri' for distinguished service in any field. The awards are announced on the occasion of Republic Day every year.

These awards are con-

ferred by President Ram Nath Kovind at ceremonial functions which are held at Rashtrapati Bhawan usually around March/ April every year. This year the President has approved conferment of 128 Padma Awards including 2 duo case (in a duo case, the Award is counted as one) as per list below. The list comprises 4 Padma Vibhushan, 17 Padma Bhushan and 107 Padma Shri Awards.

34 of the awardees are women and the list also includes 10 persons from the category of Foreigners/NRI/PIO/OCI and 13 posthumous awardees.

Leader of Opposition in Rajya Sabha Mallikarjun Kharge on Monday said that no political parties in the country should politicise religion or caste.

Three candidates file nomination for two Assam RS seats



GUWAHATI : Three candidates, two from the BJP-led ruling alliance and one from the Congress as the joint opposition nominee, on Monday filed their nomination papers for elections to the two Rajya Sabha seats from Assam, scheduled to be held on March 31.

The BJP's Pabitra Margherita, its alliance partner UPPL's Rwngra Narzary and Congress candidate and sitting Rajya Sabha MP Ripun Bora filed their nomination papers in the assembly secretary's office here.

Monday is the last day of filing nomination papers.

Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma accompanied Margherita when the candidate filed nomination papers. Margherita's victory is assured while a contest is on the cards for the other seat with the chief minister urging all Congress MLAs to vote for the candidate of the ruling alliance for that seat.

"We do not want the votes of the AIUDF but I urge all Congress MLAs to vote for the ruling alliance candidates as they can raise the voice of the people and the state in the Rajya Sabha," Sarma said.

The CM's visit to the residence of suspended Congress MLA Sashi Kanta Das on Sunday had created a stir as he announced that

he would vote for the candidates of the ruling alliance.

Congress Legislature Party leader Debabrata Saikia told reporters outside the assembly that the chief minister has resorted to 'horse-trading' and is out to destroy the democratic process in the state.

"The opposition parties, AIUDF and the Rajior Dal had agreed to support the Congress candidate and accordingly Bora's candidature was announced. Realising that it would be difficult for the second candidate of the ruling alliance to win, the chief minister has reached out to our party MLAs," Saikia said.

Admitting that the BJP has reached out to Congress MLAs, the CM asserted that it does not amount to horse-trading. "I will also talk to them while party members will go to their homes with gamosa and tamul-paan and request them to vote for the ruling alliance candidates," he said.

In Assam, 'gamosa' (traditional hand towel) and 'tamul-paan' (areca nut and betel leaves) are presented to people as a sign of respect.

The present condition of the Congress in the entire country is pitiable and "I request the elected members of the opposition to

consider which party can ensure the well-being of the people and the state," Sarma said.

"If an MLA does not weigh the pros and cons before voting, it is only then that he should be called a horse and not the other way round," Sarma quipped.

On Bora's statement that all Congress MLAs will receive Rs 10 lakh each year for their assembly constituencies from his MP Development Fund, Sarma said the legislators should question him why he did not give it in the last six years when he was a Rajya Sabha member.

Both the seats for which elections have been scheduled are currently held by Congress members- Bora and Rane Narah.

There are seven Rajya Sabha seats from Assam. Three of them are held by the BJP and one by its alliance partner AGP. The Congress and an independent member hold the three other seats.

In the 126-member state assembly, the ruling NDA has 79 seats with 63 from BJP, nine from AGP and seven from the UPPL. Among the opposition parties, there are 27 MLAs from the Congress, 15 from AIUDF, three from BPF and one from the CPI(M) while there is an independent member.

The BPF has lent its support to the government in the assembly but is yet to enter into a political alliance formally.

MLAs will participate in the Rajya Sabha election as members of the Upper House of Parliament are elected by legislators in state assemblies. It is an election through proportional representation.
