Mizoram's adult HIV prevalence rate much higher than national average

Mizoram reached its peak level in 2017, whereas other states had already reached their peak levels by 2005

AIZAWL, Sept 14: Mizoram has reported 29,514 HIV-positive cases since 1990, making the bordering northeastern state with the highest prevalence of HIV infections in India, an official said on Saturday.

The official of the Mizoram State AIDS Control Society (MSACS) said that according to the National AIDS Control Organisation (NACO) estimate for 2023, Mizoram has an adult HIV prevalence rate of 2.73 per cent, which is higher than the national level of 0.2 per cent.

This is because Mizoram has a high rate of HIV detection, having reached its peak level later than other states, the official pointed out.

He said in 2017, Mizoram reached its peak level, whereas other states had already reached their peak levels by 2005. After reaching its peak, the number of new HIV cases in Mizoram has been declining. He said that there are currently 16,217 PLHV (People Living with HIV) on Antiretroviral Therapy (ART) in Mizoram.

The official said that to further prevent the spread of HIV/AIDS in the mountainous state, Chief Minister La Mautouma recently launched the Intensified IEC Campaign - "India's Fight

Against HIV/AIDS & STI for Mizoram" and the campaign is now underway in all 11 districts.

The Chief Minister urged for enhanced involvement from churches, NGOs, associations, and the general public to address this issue. He called for a collaborative effort to address the growing challenge and stressed that increased awareness and prevention measures are crucial.



Since 2005, AIDS-related deaths have been documented, and till March 2024,

a total of 5,021 AIDS-related deaths have been documented.

MSACS officials said that to prevent the spread of HIV efforts are being made to protect newborns from HIV-positive mothers.

Last year, out of 120 HIV-positive pregnant women, only two babies were found to be HIV-positive. To further success in this effort, it is essential to identify the status of pregnant women quickly.

MSACS officials believe that if they continue their efforts, they can control the spread of HIV/AIDS. After discussing the report, they decided on their future course of action.

An intensive IEC Campaign under "India's Fight Against HIV/AIDS & STI" was held on Saturday at Serchhip district as part of a nationwide initiative to spread awareness about HIV/AIDS and sexually transmitted infections (STI). The Deputy Commissioner of Serchhip district Paul L. Khuma empha-

sized the importance of preventing and controlling the spread of HIV/AIDS and STIs, he stated that while these diseases pose a serious threat, they can be avoided with proper care and awareness.

He urged students to remain vigilant, practice safe behaviours, and avoid activities such as drug use and unsafe sexual activities.

The Deputy Commissioner encouraged students to stay vigilant, adopt safe behaviours, and refrain from risky activities such as drug use and unsafe sexual practices.

Khuma also emphasised the importance of applying the knowledge gained from the campaign in daily life and urged participants to spread awareness within their communities, to make Serchhip district, Mizoram, and the nation free from HIV/AIDS.

Smuggling of drugs from Myanmar is rampant in Mizoram and the Assam Rifles, Mizoram police and other law enforcing agencies regularly confiscate various drugs including heroin and methamphetamine tablets, also known as Yaba tablets or party tablets. Curfew to be relaxed in four Manipur dists from 5 am to 12 noon on Sunday

IMPHAL, Sept 14: Manipur authorities on Saturday announced that the curfew will be relaxed in all areas of Imphal West, Imphal East, Bishnupur and Thoubal districts from 5 am till 12 noon on Sunday.

As per the latest order issued by Additional District Magistrate, Imphal West District, K. Judamani Singh on Saturday, curfew has been relaxed in view of the "developing law and orders in

the district" as well as "to facilitate the general public to purchase the essential items including medicines and food items."

"Now, restriction of movement of general public outside their residences is hereby lifted for 15th September 2024 (Sunday) from 5 am to 12 noon for all areas of Imphal West district," the order signed by Additional District Magistrate said. "This relaxation shall not include any gathering/sit-in-protests/ral-

ly, etc., without obtaining approval through competent authority."

The district administrations of Imphal West, Imphal East, Bishnupur and Thoubal districts issued separate orders in this regard.

However, the movement of persons belonging to essential services such as health, electricity, CAF & PD, PHED, telecom and banking, petrol pumps, municipality, media, functioning of court and to and fro of flight passengers to airport and con-

tractor/worker with valid airport entry permit (AEP) would be exempted from further imposition of curfew after the expiry of the said period of relaxation.

The Manipur authorities have imposed curfew in the valley districts with effect from 11 am on September 10 onwards, in view of the prevailing law and order situation arising out of the widespread students' protests over the government's alleged inaction into the ongoing violence in Manipur.

BRO-IIT Delhi signs MoU

SHILLONG, Sept 14: The Border Roads Organisation (BRO) and Indian Institute of Technology Delhi would develop a computer-based tool to assist agencies to have a reduced carbon footprint during road construction.

In this regard, the headquarters research and development establishment of BRO, Shillong has signed an MoU with IIT Delhi. The MoU would conduct research for two years before developing strategies and the computing tool to reduce carbon footprint during road construction.

"The research is expected to span 24 months and will result in the development of a computer-based tool that will assist agencies in planning road construction with a reduced carbon footprint. Once finalised and approved by the Indian Roads Congress (IRC), this tool will be made available to various road construction agencies nationwide," BRO chief engineer Rajeev Dua informed.

NE India physics talent search exam

GUWAHATI, Sept 14: Physics Academy of the North East (PANE) is going to conduct the North East Physics Talent Search (NEPTS) 2024 examination for students enrolled in the Science stream in Class XI, stated a press release.

The first phase, an MCQ-based exam, will be held on October 26. NEPTS 2024 will be held in 25 centres across the Northeast. Candidates may register themselves at the PANE website by October 5.

They will be given pre-exam guidance from teachers of IITs, universities, and other higher education institutions. A total of 100 students in order of merit, including 10 State toppers from each of the 8 states, shall qualify for the second phase - an interview round.

A total of 100 students will finally be declared Northeast toppers and will receive certificates and cash prizes.

Man killed, grandchild injured as train hits car in Arunachal Pradesh

ITANAGAR, Sept 14: A 52-year-old man was killed and his grandchild injured after a train with handbikes in different parts of Nagaland, an inter-ministerial central team (IMCT) at a meeting with State Chief Secretary J. Alam and other State government officials assured to provide immediate relief assistance to the State under the central assistance schemes, especially focusing on road connectivity restoration at the earliest.

At the meeting held in the Chief Secretary's office in Kohima on Friday evening, Joint Secretary (Freedom Fighters and Rehabilitation division), Ministry of Home Affairs, Anant Kishore Saran, who leads the IMCT, said the team would give its recommendations and suggestions to the Union Home Minister for taking long-term disaster mitigation measures in the State.

Noting that the geological condition of Nagaland is very fragile, Saran said such natural disasters recur yearly in the State due to its terrain and other contributory factors.

He said the current office memorandum submitted by the State government to the Centre on monsoon disasters requires a revision.

Expressing his regret for not being able to visit all the other disaster-affected areas in the State, Saran said by visiting a few affected areas, the team was able to assess the massive damages caused by monsoon rain.

He lauded the Nagaland State Disaster Management Authority and State government for addressing and tackling the disaster scientifically.

Chief Secretary Alam briefed the central team about the various challenges Nagaland faces during the monsoon season. He urged the team to support the State with timely assistance, especially focusing on the road and its maintenance. Alam also thanked the central team for visiting the State and assessing the damages.

Redressal of complaints against entities regulated by RBI

Reserve Bank - Integrated Ombudsman Scheme (RB-IOS)

- The Reserve Bank has mandated all its regulated entities to have a mechanism at their end to receive the complaints received by them from their customers, which is considered as the Internal Grievance Redress Mechanism of regulated entities.
- The Reserve Bank has also in place an expeditious and cost free Alternate Grievance Redress Mechanism for resolution of customer complaints relating to deficiencies in services rendered by its regulated entities under the Reserve Bank - Integrated Ombudsman Scheme, 2021 (RB-IOS).
- Branch, Branch-Banking Financial Companies, Payment System Participants and Credit Information Companies are considered as regulated entities under the Grievance Redress Mechanism.
- The RB-IOS provides a "One Nation One Ombudsman" approach for all complaints against any regulated entities. It is therefore no longer necessary for a complainant to identify under which Ombudsman scheme his/her complaint is to be filed with the Ombudsman.
- Complaints against regulated entities not covered under the RB-IOS are handled at Consumer Education and Protection Cells (CEPCs) for resolution.
- The list of regulated entities covered under the ambit of RB-IOS and CEPC can be accessed by visiting <https://ios.rbi.org.in>

What to do if you have a complaint?

You can lodge complaint against the regulated entity at its branch or through online in the grievance redressal portal or any other mode as mentioned in its website. Get acknowledgement or save the reference number of the complaint.

When to approach the RBI Ombudsman?

You can approach the RBI Ombudsman, in case:-

- No reply is received from the regulated entity within 30 days of a complaint within one year and 30 days from the date of your complaint to regulated entity.
- Reply received from the regulated entity is unsatisfactory. Anytime within one year of receipt of reply from the concerned regulated entity.

Notes:

- The complaint should contain all requisite details / information as per the complaint form prescribed in the RB-IOS.
- The complainant should not have been dealt with / pending with any other forum (like Courts) or dealt earlier by the RBI Ombudsman.
- Filing complaint directly with RBI Ombudsman, without approaching the RE, may lead to its rejection.

How to lodge a complaint with RB-IT?

Complaint against the regulated entity can be filed through any of the following modes:-

- Online through the Complaint Management System (CMS) portal of RBI website (<https://ios.rbi.org.in>)
- Physical complaint (letter / post) in the form as specified in Annexure in the RB-IOS to Centralized Receipt and Processing Centre, 4th floor, Reserve Bank of India Sector-11, Central Vista, Chandraghata - 110007
