103 sovereign gold jewels stolen from locked house near Kuniyamuthur

AROUND 103 sovereigns of gold jewels have gone missing from a house at BK Pudur near Kuniyamuthur in Coimbatore city. The theft occurred likely in the last three days when the residents had gone to their native place in Thoothukudi on December 24 to celebrate Christmas.

The complainant, Jeba Martin (52) of Narasimmapuram in Kuniyamuthur in Coimbatore city, works as a teacher at a private school in the same area. With the school's half-yearly exams concluded and holidays declared, Jeba along with her family, had gone to their relatives' house at Sathankulam in

Thoothukudi to celebrate Christmas. Upon returning home on Friday morning, they found valuables to have been stolen.

Police sources said the residents claimed that approximately 103 sovereigns of gold

jewellery and ₹10,000 cash, kept in the wardrobe were stolen. Since the house lock and the wardrobe were not broken, police suspect that the burglars might have used keys to open the house and the wardrobe. It is also suspected that it could

be done by acquaintances of the family. Jeba's family has three sets of keys and all the family members who hold the keys had gone to Thoothukudi. A complaint was filed with the Kuniyamuthur police on Friday afternoon.

Based on the complaint, the police registered a case and collected evidence from the house with the help of the forensic team. Deputy Commissioner of Police G Karthikeyan (Coimbatore city South) visited the crime scene and conducted an investigation.

The police are now collecting CCTV footage from the area and investigation is on to nab the miscreants. Seven special teams have been formed to investigate the case.

Leopard threat: Farmers hold protest at Seeliyur

FARMERS in the Karamadai Block staged a protest demanding measures to prevent the intrusion of leopards into farm fields. Farmers gathered on the Thayanur-Tholampalayam road after two goats were killed in a farm at Seeliyur near Karamadai by a wild animal, suspected to be a leopard.

Enraged, farmers led by T Venugopal, president of Tamilaga Vivasayigal Sangam, gathered on the road at Seeliyur and staged a protest with the carcass of a goat.

On Friday, Pathiramal found two of her goats dead and one battling for life in a

temporary enclosure in a farm belonging to Masannan of Seeliyur. More than two-dozen goats were in the enclosure.

The protesters claimed leopard intrusions into farms situated near the forest boundary have increased recently.

They alleged that farmers have been losing goats enclosed in sheds to the predator and this has been occurring for the last four years.

Forest department officials of the Karamadai Range rushed to the place and held a talk with the farmers. They called off the protest, after the officials assured to provide compensation to the farmers concerned and place cages to capture the leopard entering the village.

Ex-cop gets three yrs' jail for taking ₹10,000 bribe from financier

A Special Court for Prevention of Corruption Cases on Friday sentenced a former head constable to three years of imprisonment for accepting a bribe of ₹10,000 from the owner of a finance firm in 2009.

According to sources, D Ramasamy (59), was serving as head constable at the Boiler Plant Police Station.

On June 12, 2009, he approached M Gunasekaran of Gandhi Nagar in Thiruverumbur, who was running a finance business, and demanded ₹10,000, claiming that he could help him evade arrest in a case booked by the Delhi Police. Based on Gunasekaran's complaint, officials of the Directorate of Vigilance and Anti-Corruption laid a trap and arrested Ramasamy. He was dismissed from service on November 2, 2009. On Friday, judge V Puviyarasu sentenced Ramasamy and imposed a fine of ₹4,000. Gunasekaran died during the course of the trial.

Sabarimala rush: Four spl trains via Salem, Kovai

COIMBATORE: The Salem Division of Southern Railway has announced the operation of four special train services to manage the surge in passenger traffic during the ongoing Sabarimala pilgrimage season. The trains will connect Narasapur in Andhra Pradesh and Charlapalli in Telangana with Kollam in Kerala. Two special services will operate between Narasapur and Kollam. Train No. 07125 will depart Narasapur at 1 pm on December 27 and reach Kollam at 10 pm the next day. The return service, Train No. 07126, will leave Kollam at 2.30 am on December 29 and arrive at Narasapur the following afternoon. These trains will halt at important stations including Jolarpettai, Salem, Erode, Tiruppur and Podanur within the Salem Division. In addition, two special trains will run between Charlapalli and Kollam on January 10 and 17, 2026, with corresponding return services on January 12 and 19. These trains will also halt at the aforementioned stations in Tamil Nadu. ENS

One-way traffic on Ooty Ghat Road till May 5

COIMBATORE: The police department has implemented one-way traffic on the Ghat road in view of the rush of tourists to Nilgiris for the vacation. Traffic from Mettupalayam to Ooty will be allowed on the Coonoor route, and descending vehicles from Nilgiris are being diverted through the Kotagiri road to reach Mettupalayam via Charring Cross and Manekshaw Bridge until May 5. Vehicles, except for government buses from Gudalur heading to Ooty, are directed to use the HPF Golf Road, from where commuters can access government tour buses, said the Nilgiris district police.

Light vehicles travelling from Masinagudi through the Kallatti route should reach Ooty via Thalaikundha Mattam, Kozhipannai, Pudhu Mandhu and St. Stephen's Church. Vehicles, especially tourist vehicles from Coonoor, are to be parked at Aavin parking, from where commuters can use government tour buses to visit the tourist attractions. Tourist vehicles heading to Ooty from Kotagiri should go via the Kattabettu junction. ENS

Pvt schools defy orders, hold special classes in Coimbatore

DEFYING the School Education Department's order, many private schools and some aided schools in Coimbatore held special classes for Class X and XII students on Friday.

Official sources say parents and students complained to the District Educational Officer (DEO) that private schools had forced students to attend special classes on Friday. Complaints about the conduct of special classes have been received against more than 10 private schools located in and around Sulur, Mettupalayam, and nearby areas. Apart from matriculation schools, an aided school near Annur also conducted special classes for Classes 10 and 12, instructing students to come to school in uniform. Students attended the classes on Wednesday and Friday.

After a complaint from a parent, education officials warned the school not to hold special classes on Friday. Around 150 students were sent home at around 11.30 am after the classes were stopped. Offi-

cial launched an inquiry against the school management for conducting special classes, sources added.

R Ramkumar, president of the Tamil Nadu Teachers and School Protection Association, said that not only in Coimbatore but also in several other districts, many private schools have not complied with the School Education Department's order banning special classes. "Due to this, parents are unable to go to their native places, and students may face stress from attending classes during the vacation. Hence, officials should take stringent action against school managements," he urged.

K Nandakumar, DEO for private schools told TNIE that on Friday, they had received complaints about private schools conducting special classes, which is against the department's order. "Schools have been instructed to cancel the special classes. We will monitor private schools, and if any are found violating the norms, their names will be conveyed to the top officers in Chennai for further action," he said.
