12 people from Assam untraced in Nepal flash flood: CM Sarma

Guwahati, Aug 29 (IANS) Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma on Saturday said the state government has identified 12 people from Assam who remain untraced in Nepal following the flash flood incident in the neighbouring country.

Sarma said authorities are making efforts to establish contact with the missing persons and facilitate their safe rescue.

In a post on X, the Chief Minister said the government had so far been able to establish the details of 12 people from Assam who were yet to be traced in Nepal. “Efforts are underway to establish contact with them and safely rescue them,” Sarma said.

Three of those listed, Rhituopurno Brahma, Montri Basumatary and Soneswar Narzary, are residents of Daidak village

under Dokmoka police station in Karbi Anglong district.

Rahul Daimary, from Jaipukhuri under Merapani police station in Golaghat district, and Shatadal Nath of Doboka in

Hojai district, are also among those whose whereabouts remain unknown.

The list further includes people from Guwahati and Nalbari. From Guwahati, those

reported untraced are Pankaj Naug of Rukmini Gaon, along with Dipali Sarkar and Manash Kr Ghosh of Lankeshwar. Pankaj Barman, Arun Mahanta and Samar Bezbaruah from Nalbari are also on the list. Tirtha Chaliha of Nalbari Medical College and Hospital has likewise been reported untraced.

The list of persons was prepared on August 28 as authorities continued efforts to locate Assam residents affected by the flash flood in Nepal.

The Assam government is coordinating efforts to obtain information about the affected individuals and establish communication with them.

Officials are also working towards ensuring their safe return, as the situation remains a matter of concern for families in the state.

Assam govt destroyed drugs worth Rs 300 crore in 100 days of crackdown

Guwahati, Aug 29 (IANS): The Assam government has destroyed narcotic substances valued at around Rs 300 crore during the first 100 days of the BJP-led administration, Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma said on Friday, underlining the state's intensified campaign against drug trafficking.

The seized contraband was destroyed at Daulasal in Nalbari district at Assam's first dedicated narcotics incineration facility.

The Chief Minister said the action reflected the government's continued efforts to dismantle drug supply chains and prevent seized narcotics from re-entering circulation.

“Tick tock on the clock, the crackdown doesn't stop. 100 days, 100% action,” Sarma said in a post on X. He said the government's

anti-drug drive was focused not only on seizures and arrests but also on eliminating trafficking networks operating across the state.

“Seizures, arrests, destruction of drug networks, we are sending one message loud and clear: There is no place to hide,” Sarma said, reiterating the government's commitment to taking strict action against drug peddlers and trafficking syndicates.

Giving details of the enforcement drive under the theme “100 days of Surakshit Assam”, Sarma said narcotics worth approximately Rs 300 crore had been destroyed at the Nalbari facility.

The Chief Minister also highlighted a series of anti-narcotics operations carried out across nine districts over a 10-day

period.

According to him, drugs estimated to be worth Rs 472.51 crore were seized during these operations.

The seizures included around 30.7 kg of heroin and 5,499 kg of ganja, besides other prohibited substances, he said.

The Assam government has stepped up its campaign against narcotics trafficking since Sarma became Chief Minister in May 2021, with enforcement agencies conducting sustained operations against drug suppliers, peddlers and trafficking networks.

The state government has repeatedly described the fight against drugs as a key priority, combining seizures, arrests and destruction of confiscated contraband with efforts to disrupt organised trafficking networks.

5 militants arrested in Manipur; CM condemns bomb attack on BJP MLA’s residence

Imphal, Aug 28 (IANS) Security forces, in separate joint operations conducted across different districts of Manipur, have arrested five militants belonging to various banned outfits during the past 24 hours, officials said here on Friday.

A police official said that the five militants were apprehended in Imphal West, Imphal East and Kakching districts during coordinated operations conducted by the Manipur Police, Assam Rifles and other Central forces. The arrested militants belong to the banned People's Liberation Army (PLA) and

its political wing, the Revolutionary People's Front (RPF), the United People's Party of Kangleipak (UPPK), and the United National Liberation Front (UNLF).

According to the police official, the arrested militants were reportedly involved in various crimes and illegal activities, including attacks on people, kidnapping, forcible collection of “subscriptions” and recruitment of youths into the banned outfits.

Meanwhile, Manipur Chief Minister Yumnam Khemchand Singh on Friday visited the residence of former Minister and sitting BJP MLA Sapam Ranjan Singh at Konthoujam Mayai Leikai in Imphal West district following a bomb blast at his residence earlier in the day.

The Chief Minister later, in a post on social media, strongly condemned the attack. “I strongly condemn such a senseless and barbaric attack on the residence of a people's representative. “This act of violence is an attack on our democracy, and the perpetrators will be brought to justice soon,” the Chief Ministersaid.

Mizoram to scale up ginger cultivation after NITI Aayog’s 'Ginger Capital' recognition

Aizawl, Aug 29 (IANS) Mizoram is set to significantly expand ginger cultivation following the NITI Aayog's recognition of the state as the 'Ginger Capital of India', Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare Minister, P.C. Vanlalruata, said.

NITI Aayog declared Mizoram the 'Ginger Capital of India' in 2025, recognising the state's large-scale production of the spice and its growing contribution to the country's ginger sector.

The state government has since undertaken initiatives to further boost ginger cultivation and strengthen its production potential, the Minister said.

Inaugurating an Edible Oil Processing Plant at Falkawn, Aizawl, the Minister said that the government accords high importance to the welfare of farmers and continues to take initiatives to promote the cultivation of crops such as sunflower seeds, sesame seeds, toor dal and mustard seeds besides ginger, while also making efforts to facilitate suitable markets for their produce.

The Edible Oil Processing Plant was established under the Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana – Detailed Project Report (RKVY-DPR) 2023-24.

A successful trial run of the machinery was also conducted on the occasion. Expressing his happiness at the establishment of a modern oilseed

processing facility within Mizoram, the Minister further stated that the government would continue to explore all possible avenues under various schemes, including RKVY, to enable farmers to make further progress.

He also highlighted the government's efforts to strengthen cooperative societies and said that the government intends to increasingly focus on the processing and value addition of agricultural produce, including ginger.

He reiterated that the government remains committed to supporting farmers and addressing their needs, adding that the emergence of various processing industries would contribute significantly to the overall development of the state.

He expressed the hope that such industries would provide farmers with sustainable livelihood opportunities and become a reliable source of income.

The Edible Oil Processing Plant is equipped to process a wide range of oil-bearing crops. The Agriculture & Farmers' Welfare Department has selected the Aizawl City Oilseed Growers and Processing Cooperative Society Ltd., to operate and manage the plant. A five-year Memorandum of Understanding for the operation of the facility was also signed on the occasion.

Manipur reserves 5 pc quota in Home Department jobs for outstanding sportspersons

Imphal, Aug 29 (IANS) Manipur Chief Minister Yumnam Khemchand Singh on Saturday said that five per cent reservation in government jobs in the state Home Department would be provided to outstanding sportspersons who have brought laurels to the state, in recognition of their achievements and services.

The Chief Minister added that if a sportsperson fails to perform for three consecutive years, he or she would be withdrawn from sports-related duties and reassigned to their regular duties.

Khemchand Singh on Saturday met Ariha Pangambam, the first Indian to win a gold medal in the recently concluded 10th Aerobic Gymnastics Asian Championships held in the Philippines

this month and Anjori Pangambam, who secured 7th position in the same event.

The Chief Minister appreciated their c o m m e n d a b l e performances in the recently concluded Asian Championship and also encouraged them to continue their hard work and bring more laurels to the state and the nation in the future. Later, he launched a booklet published by the Manipur Olympic Association.

During the launch, the Chief Minister informed that a special recruitment policy for sportspersons who brought laurels to the state was approved in the Cabinet meeting held on Friday.

He added that under this policy, sportspersons would be recruited by the state government with

complete transparency and strictly based on merit.

Meanwhile, the Manipur government on Friday announced a ‘Women Empowerment’ scheme aimed at benefiting 3.5 lakh women in the state, officials said.

According to the MLA, the incident occurred early on Friday morning when he was present at his residence. The bomb exploded in the backyard of the house, leaving a small crater on the ground and causing minor damage to the walls of the compound.

Police have registered a case and initiated an investigation into the incident.

Meanwhile, security forces comprising the Central Armed Police Forces (CAPFs) and the Manipur Police have continued extensive counter-insurgency operations, including search operations and area-domination exercises, in fringe, mixed-population and other vulnerable areas across the state.

As part of the intensified security measures, 111 nakas and checkpoints have been set up across the valley and hill districts to monitor the movement of militants, anti-social elements and suspicious vehicles.

The security forces have also been providing armed escorts to trucks and other vehicles carrying essential commodities along the strategically important Imphal-Jiribam National Highway (NH-37).

Strict security arrangements and convoy protection continue to remain in place along vulnerable stretches of the highway to ensure the safe and uninterrupted movement of passenger and goods vehicles, the officials said.

Over 1,700 passengers travel from Imphal as inter-state bus services continue after over 3 years

Imphal, Aug 29 (IANS) More than 1,700 passengers, including women, have travelled smoothly from Imphal to Nagaland's Dimapur and Assam's main city of Guwahati via National Highway-2 over the past week, following the resumption of inter-state public transport services after a gap of more than three years.

In a major development, inter-state passenger bus services between Manipur, Assam and Nagaland resumed on August 21 for the first time after the ethnic violence broke out on May 3, 2023.

A Manipur transport department official said that the resumption of public road transport service along the Imphal-Dimapur-Guwahati route via National Highway-2 continued smoothly, with more than 400 passengers departing from Imphal in 19 vehicles on Saturday.

The vehicles comprising eight buses and 11 wingers left Imphal on Saturday morning.

The official noted that the steady movement of public transport along NH-2 underscores the ongoing efforts by authorities to facilitate safe and hassle-free travel for passengers on this vital route.

Various sections of society have been

appreciating the state government led by Chief Minister Yumnam Khemchand Singh for such a positive initiative.

Saturday marks the first day since the resumption of public road transport along NH-2 that the number of passengers has crossed the 400 mark, reaching 428, the official added.

Commuters from diverse communities have been travelling via NH-2 since August 21, 2026. More than 1,700 individuals have successfully travelled from Imphal to Dimapur, Nagaland's main commercial city, and Guwahati via NH-2 over the past week.

The movement of transport vehicles was suspended on Friday due to a shutdown in Senapati district following the violent incident on Thursday (August 27).

Four members of the Liangmai Naga community, including the Principal of a private school, were killed and another person injured in an ambush by armed militants in Manipur's Kangpokpi district on Thursday.

Union Home Minister Amit Shah had earlier lauded the state government's initiative for successfully resuming the Imphal-Dimapur-Guwahati bus service and ensuring

free movement on the National Highway 2.

Chief Minister Khemchand Singh had earlier stated that the resumption of public road transport services (between Imphal and Guwahati) will provide much-needed relief to the people of Manipur, particularly students studying outside the state and those travelling for medical treatment.

It may be recalled that the resumption of transport service along NH-2 comes after the Chief Minister, Deputy Chief Minister Nemcha Kipgen and local MLA Haokholet Kipgen jointly announced the reopening of National Highways for free movement of all communities and the resumption of Imphal—Dimapur—Guwahati bus service on August 8 at Kangpokpi district.

The Imphal-Jiribam National Highway (NH-37) and the Imphal-Dimapur-Guwahati National Highway (NH-2) are the two crucial lifelines of Manipur, connecting the state with the rest of the country.

The passenger bus services along National Highway-2 had remained disrupted following the outbreak of ethnic violence between the Meitei and Kuki-Zo tribal communities in Manipur on May 3, 2023.

Rijiju's hint at special Parliament session triggers political exchange

New Delhi, Aug 29 (IANS) The National Democratic Alliance (NDA) on Saturday backed Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju's indication that a special session of the Parliament could be convened, while the Opposition hit out at the move, accusing it of "misreading the mood" by attempting to implement delimitation in the garb of women's reservation.

This comes after Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge wrote to Prime Minister Narendra Modi asking whether the government planned to convene a special session of Parliament to pass the proposed delimitation Bill. Kharge said he was reiterating the demand after Rijiju reportedly indicated in a television interview that a

special session could be convened.

Shiv Sena Spokesperson Shaiba NC supported Rijiju, saying: "As the Parliamentary Affairs Minister, he has always reached out to the Opposition...if a special session is announced, it is a pre-emptive move for all stakeholders to partake and understand their parliamentary responsibilities."

BJP spokesperson Pratul Shahdeo said that the government had "resolved to re-introduce the women's reservation and delimitation bill" when the Constitution (103rd Amendment) Bill, 2026 was defeated in the Lok Sabha.

"It is Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Home Minister Amit Shah's resolve that we will

implement women's reservation and coming to delimitation, it has taken place in the past as well. People are being misled (the Opposition) that the number of seats will go down...they (Opposition) are indulging in negative politics and will be exposed in the next session (of the Parliament) is convened," he told IANS.

However, the Opposition hit back, with Purnima MP Pappu Yadav saying that Kireen Rijju as well as the entire government "is frustrated". "They (government) have got nothing to do with the country's future...The women's reservation Bill was passed three years ago, but they do not seem to be serious about women's reservation, specially the poor and middleclass women," he told IANS.

Sexual assault on minor girl Hostel warden jailed for 20 years

Dharmanganam, Aug 29: A POCSO court in North Tripura has sentenced a hotel warden to 20 years of rigorous imprisonment for sexually abusing a minor girl by assaulting a minor girl over a period of nearly two months at St. Peter School in Kanchanpur.

Special Judge of the POCSO Justice S. S. Chowdhury, pronounced the sentence on Saturday. The convict-Uday Kumar Reang was responsible for the security of the school and the admission of the school hostel.

According to details of the case, Reang had allegedly subjected the minor student to repeated sexual assault over a period of two months before November 21, 2022. The assaults reportedly took place at different locations within the hostel, including the kitchen and the school verandah, where he allegedly

summoned the student for multiple occasions. Following a complaint, a case was registered at Kanchanpur police station and subsequently came up for trial before the POCSO Court. During the prolonged trial, the court recorded the statements of a total of 16 witnesses.

After the final arguments were completed on August 27, the court found Uday Kumar Reang guilty and sentenced him to 20 years of rigorous imprisonment for the offence of sexual abuse with an additional six months of imprisonment in case of non-payment of the fine.

The court also awarded him a term of rigorous imprisonment of the Indian Penal Section 506. However, as per the court's direction, both sentences shall run concurrently.

Advocate A. Sudarshan Sharma prosecuted the case.
