

Two arrested for impersonating Navy officers, cheating women on Instagram

New Delhi, | Ew News

Two fraudsters were arrested for posing as Navy officers, doctors and engineers in foreign countries and cheating women on social media site Instagram, a police officer said on Saturday. With the arrest of the duo identified as Sunder Singh (22), a resident of Nilothi Extension, West Delhi and Harmony Samuel (27), a Nigerian national, the police claimed to have solved 10 cases of cheating in which women were duped of lakhs of rupees. According to police, an FIR was registered on October 25, in which the complainant alleged

that she received a message from an unknown Instagram ID 'marino ingegnere' for friendship who introduced himself as a Sea Engineer from Norway. Subsequently, the individual proposed marriage to the complainant and mentioned their intention to send gifts and Euros from Norway. To receive these gifts/parcels, the complainant was asked to cover the custom clearance charges. Additionally, the alleged person requested the complainant to provide funds for his airfare to India. In total, the complainant transferred an approximate sum of Rs 11.39,000 to various accounts

specified by the fraudster," said Deputy Commissioner of Police (Dwarka), M Harsha Vardhan. During the investigation, the authorities obtained information regarding the beneficiary's bank account. "Through technical surveillance and a detailed analysis of the account information, the suspect was traced to Chandra Vihar. The person involved in the fraud, identified as Sunder Singh, was arrested for receiving the ill-gotten money in his bank account," said the DCP. Upon interrogation, Singh revealed that he operated a grocery store and received the fraudulent funds in his accounts at the be-

hest of a Nigerian national, who acted as a middleman on a commission basis. "Singh retained a portion of the cheated amount, approximately 10 per cent, as his commission, and then provided the remaining funds to the co-accused Nigerian national in cash," said the DCP. A strategic operation was subsequently set up in the vicinity of Chandra Vihar near Singh's grocery store, leading to the apprehension of the co-accused Nigerian national. Identified as Harmony Samuel, he was found to possess images portraying himself as a Sea engineer on his mobile phone," said the DCP. The investigation

revealed that the Nigerian accused person operated multiple fake Instagram accounts, impersonating foreigners such as Navy Officers, Doctors, Engineers, and others from various foreign countries. "Using these accounts, he engaged in regular conversations with girls and women, gradually gaining their trust and even proposing marriage. The fraudsters sent fictitious gifts and parcels to Indian airports, prompting the victims to cover custom clearance charges through different bank accounts, ultimately deceiving innocent girls and women in this manner," said the DCP.

New Age tech can enable India achieve Net Zero goal, curb air pollution

Reeling under frequent bouts of air pollution that may shorten an average Indian's life expectancy by 5.3 years, there are New Age technologies that can be deployed in India to achieve the goal of 'Net Zero', demonstrating that the process of economic growth "need not come at the cost of our environment or indeed the health of our citizens". According to Chandra Bhushan, one of India's foremost environment and climate change experts, technologies like electric vehicles (EVs), batteries, photovoltaic cells and hydrogen fuel, while reducing the dependence on fossil fuel energy, can help the country achieve decarbonisation and fight the menace of air pollution. In an article written on the website of the Heinrich Boell Foundation, a German foundation and part of the green political movement, he emphasised that the barrier is



neither technical nor cost, but policy priorities. "But these policy challenges are a cause for action, not panic. No one expects us to reach Net Zero tomorrow. But the right policies need to be implemented now so that they can take full effect over 30 years," he wrote. The fossil fuel economy has delivered many benefits, including national development. "Decarbonisation will bring some costs, especially for those who are dependent on fossil fuels for jobs and growth and those currently able to access cheap energy," said Bhushan. But there has been evidence for a while that this development is not well dis-

tributed and directed. "For instance, the externalities of fossil fuel energy are disproportionately borne by the most vulnerable. Communities around coal mines and power plants are exposed to horrifying levels of air pollution, which in turn cause lung and heart disease," he noted. More Indians own cars today than 50 years ago, but our city air has become unbreathable. A recent Lancet-published study puts a shocking number on "premature deaths and morbidity attributable to air pollution" -- \$36.8 billion in economic losses to India (or 1.4 per cent of GDP) in 2019 alone. To fulfil the obligations under the Paris

Agreement, in November 2021 at the 26th Conference of Parties (COP26) in Glasgow, Prime Minister Narendra Modi pledged that India would reach net zero emissions by 2070 and meet 50 per cent of its electricity requirements from renewable sources by the year 2030. This is possible with the right and timely use of available technologies. "The past two decades have seen a revolution in renewable energy technologies -- solar costs have fallen 90 per cent over the past decade. Building new solar power in India is now cheaper than building a new coal plant, and is quickly becoming cheaper than running existing coal plants," said Bhushan. While renewable energy needs electricity storage to be as reliable as coal power, Moody's projects that wind and solar, including storage cost, will be competitive with coal in India in 2025. Another turning point is the battery/storage revolution coming.

Rajasthan: ED seizes Rs 2.21 cr in Jal Jeevan scam case

Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Saturday said that after searches at 26 locations in Rajasthan in connection with the alleged Jal Jeevan Mission scam case, it has seized more than Rs 2.21 crore, including unaccounted cash of Rs 48 lakh and Bank balance Rs 1.73 crore. The ED teams conducted searches on the official and residential premises of senior PHED officials including Subodh Agarwal, ACS (PHED) in addition to private individuals. The ED case is based on the FIR registered by the ACB Rajasthan against Padamchand Jain Proprietor of Shree Shyam Tubewell Company, Mahesh Mittal Proprietor of Shree Ganpati Tubewell Company and others including PHED officials. It said that another FIR was also registered by the Rajasthan Police, Bajor



Nagar Police station under various sections of IPC on the basis of complaint alleging therein use of fake and fabricated work experience certificate by one of the suspected firms. "ED investigation revealed that the said contractors were involved in securing tenders pertaining to Jal Jeevan Mission works based on purported fake work completion certificates issued by Indian Railway Construction International Limited (IRCIN) and by bribing senior PHED officials. Several middle men and property dealers have

aided the PHED officials in siphoning off the illegally earned money from the JIM scam," the ED said in a statement. "During the search operations, a total of Rs 2.21 crore including unaccounted cash of Rs 48 lakh and bank balance Rs 1.73 crore, various incriminating documents including property documents, digital evidences, hard disks, mobiles etc. have been frozen and seized which reveal suspicious transactions involved in associated persons," the ED said. Till date total seizure in this case is Rs 11.03 crore, including.

SC sets aside 'strange' MP HC order asking police to give opportunity to accused before filing of charge sheet

The Supreme Court has set aside an order passed by the Madhya Pradesh High Court which had asked an Investigating Officer to give an opportunity to the accused to explain the material collected against him during the investigation before submission of the charge sheet to the Magistrate. Bench of Justices Abhay S. Oka and Pankaj Mishra held that such an approach adopted by the High Court is "very strange and contrary to law". The bench said that the accused application seeking quashing of criminal proceedings has not been considered on merits by the High Court and therefore, directed restoration of the plea filed under 482 CrPc (Code of Criminal Procedure). "We direct the Registrar (Judicial) of the Madhya Pradesh High Court to



list the restored petition before the roster Bench on 8th December, 2023 in the morning. The parties shall appear before the roster Bench on that day," it ordered. Further, the top court extended the interim protection granted against any coercive action till January 8, 2024.

It added that a liberty is given to the accused to apply before the High

Court deems it fit to impose costs of Rs 20,000/- on the Union of India. Let the Costs be paid to the Petitioner within 6 weeks from today. Delhi HC imposes fine on Centre for 'failing' to release pension to freedom fighter

The Delhi High Court has imposed a cost of Rs 20,000 on the Union Government for its "laxadaisical approach" and "failure" to provide the 'Swatantra Saimit Samman Pension' to a 96-year-old freedom fighter who actively participated in the country's struggle for independence. Justice Subramonium Prasad expressed strong disapproval for the Central Government's "inaction", which he deemed an insult to the freedom fighter, Uttam Lal Singh. Singh was declared a proclaimed offender, and his land could have been attached during the proceedings initiated by the then British Government. The court directed the Union Government to release the pension to the freedom fighter within 12 weeks, along with interest at a rate of 6 per cent per annum from August 1, 1980, until the date of payment. In his order, Justice Prasad stated: "For the laxadaisical approach of the Union of India, this

Congress fought British, we won't be threatened: Kharge

New Delhi, Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge on Saturday slammed the BJP government accusing it of misusing central agencies and said that the party fought against British and made them leave India. In a post on X, Kharge said, "It is work of Modi government to misuse ED, CBI and Income Tax during elections and threaten Congress." "But the Congress which fought against British and made them to leave India, then what is Modi and Shah," Kharge added. His remarks came after the ED on Friday in a statement said that the Enforcement Directorate (ED) claimed that a forensic analysis and a statement made by a "cash courier" had led to "startling allegations" that the promoters of the Mahadev betting app paid about Rs 508 crore to the Chhattisgarh Chief Minister so far, and that "these are subject matter of investigation". The ED also claimed that it had recovered Rs 5.39 crore cash from the courier, whom it identified as Asim Das. A charge sheet was recently filed by the ED in the Mahadev app case where a total of 14 accused were named including main promoters Sourabh Chandrakar and Ravi Uppal. Polling for 90 member assembly in Chhattisgarh is scheduled on November 7 and 17 in two phases and counting of votes will December 3.

One dead as DTC bus rams into car, two-wheelers in Delhi

New Delhi, A 30-year-old man died while another sustained injuries after a DTC bus lost control and hit a car and some two wheelers in Delhi's Rohini area on Saturday, an officer said. The videos of the incident were also doing the rounds on social media. In one video, a bus was observed dragging a car, an e-rickshaw, and a bike that it had collided with. The bus continued moving until it finally came to a stop, during which it also crashed into several scooters parked near the sidewalk. A separate video of the same incident captured bystanders fleeing for safety as the bus collided with the bicycles and scooters. Startled onlookers, their hands raised above their heads in disbelief, hurried to the scene to assess the condition of those who had been struck by the bus. According to police, a PCR call regarding an accident near Mother Divine School, Rohini was received at South Rohini police station on Saturday. Upon reaching the spot, police came to know that the injured person had been shifted to Baba Saheb Ambedkar Hospital where one person, aged about 30 years, was declared brought dead. One more injured person in the accident is under treatment.

BJP scared of AAP: Atishi on case against Gujarat MLA

Chennai police fine 184 vehicles on day one of speed limit violations

CHENNAI: Greater Chennai Police imposed a fine on 184 vehicles on day one of the implementation of new speed limits on City roads. While the Police itself were going soft on the violators to allow breathing time for the vehicle users to get accustomed to the new rules, water-stagnant roads due to the rains played their part in slowing down motorists. While traffic police personnel imposed a spot fine of its 1000 on 121 vehicles, 63 motorists who were captured in ANPR cameras were issued challans, police said. Of the 121 vehicles issued spot fines, 117 were two-wheelers and another four were four-wheelers, said a senior police officer. "We have six-speed radar machines available. More machines are on the way and will be deployed soon. We also used the ANPR cameras by setting up the speed limit and used interceptor vehicles," said a senior police officer. The ANPR cameras were set for the speed limit of 50 km per hour to trace the two-wheelers, which have a higher number of violations, said the police. In the coming days, the enforcement will be strict, police said. As per the notification,



light motor vehicles (cars) can go at a maximum speed of 60 km per hour (kmph) while two-wheelers can go up to 50 kmph. Heavy motor vehicles have to stick to a maximum speed of 50 kmph and auto-rickshaws to 40 kmph. But in residential areas, all categories of vehicles should go at 30 kmph or less. "We are trying to evolve a system where technology meets regulation. The Automatic Number Plate Reading (ANPR) cameras will be calibrated according to the vehicles and speed limit, and they will detect violators," city police Commissioner Sandeep Rai Rathore had told DT Next.

Civic body would tackle situation even if Chennai receives 20 cm of rainfall: Nehru

CHENNAI: The civic body is prepared to tackle the situation even if the city receives 20 cm of rainfall in a single day, we would pump out the stagnated water within an hour, Municipal Administration Minister K.N. Nehru said after monitoring the live stream of integrated monsoon command control center on Saturday. At least 98 percent of stormwater drains inter-linking works have been completed in the core areas of the capital city resulting in relief from water logging. Speaking to the reporters, the Minister explained that the city received 11 cm of rainfall in the last two days and the Corporation was able to pump out the stagnated water on the roads and subways within an hour without interrupting the vehicle movement. Eating strawberries daily when young may cut dementia risk later

Daily strawberry consumption could help reduce the risk of dementia for certain middle-aged populations, finds a study. According to researchers from the University of Cincinnati, the metabolic and cardiovascular benefits of strawberry consumption have been studied previously, but there were relatively few studies on its cognitive effects. In the new study, published in the journal Nutrients, the team included a total of 30 overweight patients between 50-65 years old with complaints of mild cognitive decline. This population has an increased risk for late-life dementia and other common conditions, said Robert Krikorian, professor at the varsity's Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Neuroscience.



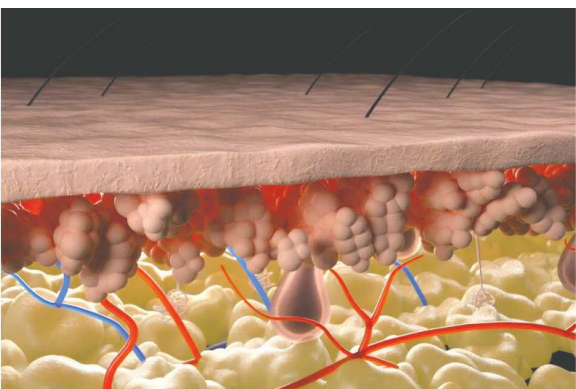
Over a period of 12 weeks, the participants were asked to abstain from berry fruit consumption of any kind except for a daily packet of supplement powder to be

mixed with water and consumed with breakfast. Half of the participants received powders that contained the equivalent of one cup of whole strawberries (the standard serving size), while the other half received a placebo. Those in the strawberry powder group had diminished memory interference, which is consistent with an overall improvement in executive ability. "Reduced memory interference refers to less confusion of semantically related terms on a word-list learning test," Krikorian said. This phenomenon generally is thought to reflect better executive control in terms of resisting intrusion of non-target words during the memory testing." The strawberry-treated participants also had a significant reduction of depressive symptoms, which

Krikorian said can be understood as a result from "enhanced executive ability that would provide better emotional control and coping and perhaps better problem-solving." While more research is needed, Krikorian said the strawberry treatment may have improved cognitive function by reducing inflammation in the brain. "Executive abilities begin to decline in midlife and excess abdominal fat, as in insulin resistance and obesity, will tend to increase inflammation, including in the brain," he said. "So, one might consider that our middle-aged, overweight, prediabetic sample had higher levels of inflammation that contributed to at least mild impairment of executive abilities. Accordingly, the beneficial effects we observed might be related to moderation of inflammation in the strawberry group."

New super melanin cream to heal your skin from chemical, sunburn

Scientists have developed a synthetic, biomimetic melanin cream that heals damage occurring throughout the day when your skin is exposed to sunlight or environmental toxins. In the new study, the scientists at Northwestern University showed that their synthetic melanin, mimicking the natural melanin in human skin, can be applied topically to injured skin, where it accelerates wound healing. These effects occur both in the skin itself and systemically in the body. When applied in a cream, the synthetic melanin can protect skin from sun exposure and heals skin injured by sun damage or chemical burns, the scientists said. The technology, published in the journal npj Regenerative Medicine, works by scavenging free radicals, which are produced by injured skin such as a sunburn. Left unchecked, free radical activity damages cells and ultimately may result in skin ageing and skin cancer. Melanin in humans and animals provides pigmentation to the skin, eyes and hair. The substance protects your cells from sun damage with increased pigmentation



in response to sunlight - a process commonly referred to as tanning. That same pigment in your skin also naturally scavenges free radicals in response to damaging environmental pollution from industrial sources and automobile exhaust fumes. When the scientists created the synthetic melanin engineered nanoparticles, they modified the melanin structure to have higher free radical scavenging capacity. "The synthetic melanin is capable of scavenging more radicals per gram compared to human melanin," said Nathan Gianneschi, Professor of Chemistry, Materials Science & Engineering, Biomedical Engineering and Pharmacology at Northwestern.

"It's like super melanin. It's biocompatible, degradable, nontoxic and clear when rubbed onto the skin. In our studies, it acts as an efficient sponge, removing damaging factors and protecting the skin." Once applied to the skin, the melanin sits on the surface and is not absorbed into the layers below. "The syn-

thetic melanin stabilises and sets the skin on a healing pathway, which we see in both the top layers and throughout the body," Gianneschi said. The scientists, who have been studying melanin for nearly 10 years, first tested their synthetic melanin as a sunscreen. "It protected the skin and skin cells from damage," Gianneschi said. "Next, we wondered if the synthetic melanin, which functions primarily to soak up radicals, could be applied topically after a skin injury and have a healing effect on the skin. It turns out to work exactly that way."

The team envisions the synthetic melanin cream being used as a sunscreen booster for added protection and as an enhancer in moisturiser to promote skin repair. "You could put it on before you go out in the sun and after you have been in the sun. In both cases, we showed reduction in skin damage and inflammation. You are protecting the skin and repairing it simultaneously. It's continuous repair," said dermatologist Dr. Kurt Lu, Professor of Dermatology at Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine.
