PM holds meeting with CM Patel, others

PRIME MINISTER Narendra Modi Saturday held a meeting with Gujarat Chief Minister Bhupendra Patel, state BJP chief CR Patil and senior government officials at a facility near Ahmedabad airport soon after landing here on a two-day Gujarat visit.

Others present at the meeting included ministers Harsh Sanghani and Jagdish Vishwakarma as well as K Kalishankar, chief principal sec-

retary to the CM, sources said. Ministers Sanghani and Vishwakarma were given additional portfolios of revenue and roads and buildings respectively after the CM stripped cabinet ministers Rajendra Trivedi and Purnesh Modi of these key portfolios, a week ago.

After the PM landed here, he was welcomed by Governor Anant Patel, CM Patel, state BJP president CR Patil, ministers Harsh Sanghani and Jagdish Vishwakarma and others at Ahmedabad airport.

State Chief Secretary Pankaj

Kumar, Kalashankar, Director General of Police Ashish Bhatia and senior officers were also present.

Inaugurates Atal Bridge

The prime minister later inaugurated the 300-metre long 'Atal Bridge' for pedestrians and cyclists across the Sabarmati river in Ahmedabad.

It was a tribute by the local people to former prime minister late Atal Bihari Vajpayee, he said. The prime minister, accompanied by Gujarat Chief Minister Bhupendra Patel and state BJP

chief CR Patil, also took a stroll on the bridge and waved at people.

'Atal Bridge' not only connects the two banks of Sabarmati river but it is also unique in design and innovation. In its design, the famous kite festival has been kept in mind.

Modi said during the Khadi Utsav event from where he inaugurated the bridge. "Gandhinagar and Gujarat have also given a lot of love to Atal ji. In 1996, Atal ji won the Lok Sabha election from Gandhinagar with record votes. This bridge is a heartfelt tribute to him from the

people here," the PM added.

The pedestrians and cyclists-only bridge with eye-catching design and LED lighting is 300 metres long and 14 metres wide in the middle.

It connects the flower garden on the western end of the Sabarmati Riverfront and upcoming arts and culture centre on the eastern end.

It has been built using 2,600 metric tonnes of steel pipes while the roof is made of colourful fabric and the railing built with glass and stainless steel, an official release informed.

Free treatment of up to Rs 10 lakh in Cong's healthcare manifesto

IN THE run-up to the assembly elections in Gujarat, the state unit of the Congress Saturday promised to provide free medical insurance cover worth Rs 10 lakh in government and private hospitals, in addition to free organ transplantation and elimination of contract system for doctors and paramedical staff, if voted to power.

The party also promised to deposit Rs 3000 every month in the bank accounts of every girl, and to deposit 30 lakhs when she attains the age of marriage.

The Congress, which held press conferences in Ahmedabad, Vadodra, Surat, Rajkot and Mehsana Saturday, announced its election manifesto for healthcare, titled 'Jan Arogya Sankalp Patra', which promised to upgrade all government-run hospitals to five-star category where free treatment will be provided for all citizens.

Following the footsteps of the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP), the Congress, too, promised to set up 10,000 'Jan Arogya' (public clinics) in every village and municipal wards.

The party, which has been sitting on the opposition benches for over two decades in the state, promised to allocate 7 per cent of Gujarat's annual budget to providing health care services.

The party leaders claimed that during the BJP rule in the state, there has been an acute shortage of doctors and para medical staff in primary health care centres and government hospitals, most of which were established during the Congress regime.

Senior Congress leader Naishad Desai said, "The health centres in rural villages are in a pathetic condition due to their poor structure and lack of facilities of medical equipment. These will be renovated. The privatisation policy of the BJP government will be changed and we will make a new health policy. We wanted to take Gujarat to the top position in the country in terms of healthcare."

Gujarat Pradesh Congress Committee (GPCC) President Jagdish Thakor, who addressed mediapersons in Ahmedabad, promised to eliminate hiring of doctors and paramedical staff on fixed salary and contract system.

by hiring them on rolls of government hospitals and medical colleges. The party also promised to provide treatment for fatal diseases such as cardiac, kidney ailments and cancer at special wards at the district level hospitals.

Addressing the gathering, Anant Patel, Congress MLA from Vansda said in Narsan, said, "We have made announcements for healthy children and a healthy India. After winning the 2022 local assembly elections and forming the government, our first priority will be Gujarat's health sector. Our intention is to make medical facilities available even for people living in interior villages."

The grand old party also pro-

posed starting a "hospital on wheels" for interior tribal areas and starting generic medical stores to provide cheaper medicines near hospitals. The party also promised to end malnutrition and reduce infant and maternal mortality rate in the state.

The party also promised to start sports activities among the state's youths and students, every school will have a playground, gymkhana, nature cure, and yoga centre. The Congress promised to address the issue of gender disparity in the state by formulating a policy to maintain the sex ratio of boys and girls. Awareness will be carried out in the talukas with un-even sex ratios.

ACCUSED DISAPPROVED OF SISTER'S MARRIAGE

Man kills brother-in-law using father's rifle in Chhota Udepur, arrested

THE PWD Jetter police in Chhota Udepur Friday arrested a 23-year-old man, Sachin Rathwa, for allegedly shooting dead his sister's husband with a double barrel rifle, registered in the name of his father—a Border Security Force (BSF) personnel—as he did not approve of the marriage.

The deceased, Sunil Rathwa, and the sister of the accused, Sneha, had eloped after Sneha was allegedly forcibly married off last year.

According to Arun Parmar, in-charge Police Inspector of Pavi Jetter police station, Sachin had been vengeful about Sneha's elopement with Sunil, even after the family had married her off to another man in early 2021 to break the ties with the deceased.

On Thursday, Sneha, who is pregnant and in her third trimester—was at her home with Sunil in Ghuntwad village of Pavi Jetter when Sachin barged in with the rifle and shot Sunil from a close range.

Parmar added that even after he had shot Sunil, Sachin continued to assault him with the rifle and later even obstructed the

ambulance and the emergency medical team from administering timely treatment to Sunil.

Parmar said, "Sneha, has told us that Sunil and she had registered their marriage before the Covid-19 outbreak but due to lockdown, there had been a delay in procuring the marriage certificate. Meanwhile, the family had married her off to another man in. When she learned that her certificate had arrived, she eloped with Sunil, abandoning her marriage solemnised by the family. It had left Sachin in rage and he was trying to locate them."

"He brought the rifle registered in the name of Andarsinh Rathwa, his father, and a BSF personnel deployed in Jamnru, and shot Sunil. He showed no remorse for the crime. We arrested him from the spot, where he was waiting with the rifle and confessed to having killed the deceased," Parmar added.

Police have booked Andarsinh as a co-accused and arrested Sachin under IPC Sections for murder (302), wrongful restraint (341), criminal intimidation (506(2)), and crime committed in presence of abettor (114) and relevant sections of Arms Act.

Riot near Bhuj after 20-yr-old milkman is stabbed to death

RIOTING BROKE out in Madhapur village on the outskirts of Bhuj, the district headquarters of Kutch, Friday evening after a milkman was allegedly stabbed to death by a youth due to a dispute in the village. On Saturday, cops said the accused was arrested and that the situation has turned peaceful after the State Reserve Police (SRP) and local police were deployed in the village.

The incident took place a day before PM Narendra Modi's scheduled visit to Bhuj Sunday for the inauguration of a slew of projects, including Smriti Van and a memorial for the victims of the 2001 earthquake.

Pareesh Rabari (20), a milkman

living in the Mafatnagar area of Madhapur, was allegedly stabbed by Suleman alias Badal Sama near Lohana Samaj hall in Madhapur village around 1 pm Friday, police said.

Rabari was rushed to GK General Hospital in Bhuj by his elder brother Kamlesh, who reached the spot after learning about the incident. The victim was stabbed in the chest by Sama. Rabari succumbed to his injuries while undergoing treatment in the hospital, police said.

Meanwhile, members of Rabari's community gathered at the hospital and refused to claim the body, demanding the accused be arrested first. Later in the evening, rioting broke out as a mob assembled near the railway crossing in Madhapur and targeted a religious place, shops, handcars, etc. However, police

reached the spot and dispersed the rioters.

Pareesh's family claimed his body and performed the last rites after Sama was nabbed, police said. "The accused and the victim live in the same locality and they had quarrelled over some issue around a month ago. The duo came face to face Friday and Sama stabbed Pareesh," KB Vihol, police inspector (PI) of Madhapur said. "We have deployed SRP, local police, etc. in the village and the situation is under control," he added.

The PI said a case of murder has been registered against Sama. Based on another complaint, police filed an FIR against 10 men and a mob of 50 people under various sections of the Indian Penal Code.
