'Party, Not Posts Paramount': CM Warns Miffed K'taka MLAs

Bengaluru: In his strongest warning yet to legislators disgruntled over being left out of his council of ministers, chief minister DK Shivakumar said Tuesday that MLAs threatening to quit the party were free to do so and their resignations would be accepted "within a few minutes". Party — and not posts — is paramount, he added.

The remarks came a day after the induction of 19 ministers triggered resentment among several Congress legislators, with Yashwantharajappa V Patil resigning as Indi MLA and Belur Gopalakrishna threatening to quit after missing out on cabinet berth. At least five lawmakers have openly expressed disappointment.

"Resignations keep happening in politics," Shivakumar told reporters. "No one can stop those who want to resign. The party is important. If there is a party, every-

thing else follows."

Appealing for patience, the CM cited his own political journey and that of senior Congress functionaries who waited for years before getting ministerial positions.

"I, too, could have resigned when I was not made minister during the tenure of Dharam Singh and Siddaramaiah. Didn't Parameshwara and I remain patient? During Veerendra Patil's tenure, Bangarappa, Kharge and Dharam Singh were not made ministers. Didn't Bangarappa and Dharam Singh later become CMs? One needs to have patience," he said.

On X, former minister Dinanath Gundu Rao, a six-time MLA who had held organisational positions from Youth Congress to AICC for decades, said it was disappointing that he was not considered for induction into the ministry without assigning any reason.

The former KPCC chief, son of ex-chief minister R Gundu Rao, said he would continue to work for the people and the state of Karnataka.

"That may be DK Shivakumar's style of functioning, but senior leaders should listen to the grievances of party legislators instead of saying their resignations would be accepted immediately. We are not demanding changes in the cabinet; we want the party leadership to address our concerns," former minister M C Sudhakar said.

'A'-certified 'Dhurandhar' screened in MP school, probe on

Rhopal: A video purporting to show a film certified as 'Adults Only' by CBFC being screened for children of a state-run, higher secondary school on an LED screen installed as part of a govt initiative to improve tracking in Madhya Pradesh's Maihar district sparked outrage and raised questions over oversight in digitally enabled classrooms, report Ramendra Singh & Amarjeet Singh.

The video of the alleged screening, said to have occurred on July 23, shows a scene from 'Dhurandhar' playing on an LED screen installed in a classroom. The clip, recorded by villagers, surfaced on social media Sunday and quickly went viral.

Students of various classes can be seen watching the film. A guest teacher was allegedly present at the time.

Villagers have lodged a formal complaint through CM Helpline, demanding an inquiry and strict punitive action against the teachers responsible. "The digital board was provided to enhance students' learning. Using it for obscene, non-educational content is a reckless disregard for the children's future," said a villager. In the complaint, District education officer Saloni Sharma confirmed the case had been brought to her attention.

HC commutes death awarded to man for killing wife & daughter

Raipur: Chhattisgarh HC has commuted the death sentence awarded to a man convicted of murdering his wife, infant daughter, and another man in Jan 2020 to life imprisonment without remission, observing that courts need to weigh mitigating factors before awarding capital punishment, reports Partha Behera.

Chief Justice Ramesh Sinha and justice Ravindra Kumar Agrawal, in their July 31 order, observed that although the prosecution had successfully established an unbroken chain of circumstantial evidence proving Ravi Sharma's guilt beyond reasonable doubt, it was not a "rarest of rare" case warranting death. The case came up before the HC as part of the mandatory confirmation of the death sentence awarded by a Bhilai trial court as well as Sharma's appeal against the verdict. The defence argued that Sharma retained the possibility of reformation and rehabilitation.

The Chhattisgarh High Court, Raipur, has commuted the death sentence awarded to Ravi Sharma for the murder of his wife, infant daughter, and another man in January 2020. The court observed that although the prosecution had successfully established an unbroken chain of circumstantial evidence proving Sharma's guilt beyond reasonable doubt, it was not a "rarest of rare" case warranting death. The case came up before the HC as part of the mandatory confirmation of the death sentence awarded by a Bhilai trial court as well as Sharma's appeal against the verdict. The defence argued that Sharma retained the possibility of reformation and rehabilitation.
