

Amritpal's associate flaunts arms, booked

MOGA, NOVEMBER 22

The Moga police today booked Bhagwant Singh, alias Pradhanmantri Bajke, on the charge of flaunting weapons on his social media pages.

A resident of Bajke village in Dharamkot subdivision of the district, Bajke is a close associate of radical Sikh activist Amritpal Singh and has often been seen along with him at various religious functions.

He was also a firm supporter of late Deep Sidhu, who during the farmers' movement, raised a 'Nishan Sahib flag' on the Red Fort in 2021.

He has thousands of followers on his social media accounts. He came to lime-light in the past few years for boldly speaking against the politicians in power and highlighting the issues concerning the plight of the common man, particularly the poor and marginal farming community.

A case under Section 188 of the IPC and Sections 29 and

30 of the Arms Act, 1959, has been registered against him.

ASI Devinderjit Singh said that when he, along with two home guard jawans Gopal Singh and Gurbax Singh, was on routine patrolling in Dharamkot, Dholewala and Bajke villages, he got information that Bajke was posting his photographs while flaunting weapons on the social media posts even as he has does not have any licensed weapon of his own. — TNS

Farm labourers to protest outside CM's residence

SANGRUR, NOVEMBER 22

Angry over the government's alleged failure to fulfil their demands, members of Zameen Prapti Sangharsh Committee (ZPSC) have announced a protest outside the Sangrur residence of Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on November 30.

They have started meetings in various villages to mobilise support from across Punjab.

"Repeated meetings have failed to yield any positive result for Dalits of Punjab as the leaders and officers are not taking our demands seriously. Our members from across Punjab will reach Sangrur on November 30 to protest for our demands," said Mukesh Malaud, a leader of ZPSC.

Their main demands include amendment to the law to solve the problem of reserved lands from village common lands, ensure 33 per cent representation for Dalits in village cooperative societies and cancellation of FIRs registered against ZPSC members.

Senior AAP leader from Sangrur Avtar Ealwal said since the formation of the AAP government in Punjab, many decisions had been taken for the welfare of residents.

"Our government will fulfil their demands, but we need some time," he said. — TNS

Tech mapping finds 500-km village link roads don't exist

Over 500 km of village link roads in the state does not exist. This has been revealed through a technology-based mapping of all link roads in the state.

For years, crores of rupees have been spent on the maintenance of these roads, which exist only on paper. Since 1970s, money is being regularly released from the state treasury for maintenance of roads based on the manually recorded length and there has been no accountability of this spending. However, this practice will stop now. Thanks to a new Geographical Interface System (GIS) software being used to map the length of the roads.

Information available with The Tribune reveals that the Road Data Book mentions the length of the village link roads in the entire state at 64,878 km. But the length,

measured through GIS, based on the latitude and longitude of these roads, has revealed the actual road length at 64,340 km, which is 538 km less than the manual-recorded road length data.

It is estimated that the cost of repairing a road is Rs 15 lakh per km and the road maintenance cycle is of six years. This means that every year, extra money was being spent for 90 km of these miss-

ing roads (of the 538 km of missing roads, per annum repair work is done on 90 km, which works out to be Rs 13.45 crore per annum.

The issue was in the knowledge of higher authorities in the government for the past several years. Sources say that though the successive governments tried to intervene, there was "stiff resistance" from officials in Punjab Mandi Board and Public Works

Department, the first being the nodal agency for maintenance of these roads and the latter roped in for its repair.

Interestingly, the government has also started mapping the length of 'other district roads'. In just one road of 11.91 km mapped on a pilot basis using new technology - between GT Road Gharinda to Bir Baba Budha Sahib (Amritsar district), a road length of 0.17 km shown in the Road Data Book is found missing.

"We decided to launch a tech-based GIS platform for mapping the roads sometime back. The software was bought from a private company and it has not just mapped the road length, but also automatically maps the portion of road to be repaired and the material required for the same. This technological intervention will help us save crores of rupees each year," Ravi Bhagat, Secretary, Mandi Board said.

Four milk product samples from Bathinda village fail quality test

Four out of nine samples of milk products from a dairy in Bhundar village in Bathinda district have failed to meet the requisite standards in a quality test conducted by the Health Department.

Bathinda Civil Surgeon Dr Tejwant Singh said department food teams from Mohali and Sangrur had collected nine samples of curd, milk, paneer, cream and other items from the dairy on November 12 and these were sent to a lab for testing. Of the nine samples, four samples have found to be substandard and a fly was found in one sample.

As per information, milk should contain a certain amount of fat; if the sample doesn't have the required amount of fat, it is declared as substandard.

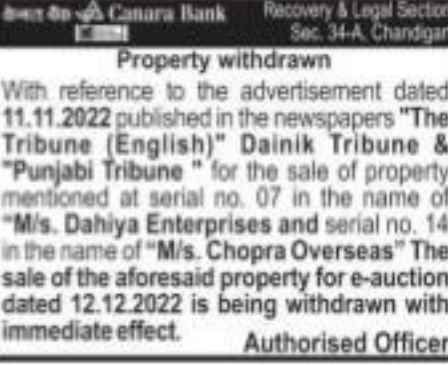

HC appoints local commissioners to look into SPCA facilities

CHANDIGARH, NOVEMBER 22

The Punjab and Haryana High Court has appointed 22 local commissioners to see, among other things, the total land/premises utilised for SPCA and infirmaries across both states. The direction by Justice Vinod S Bhardwaj came on petitions filed by Mowgliad Animal Welfare Society and others against the state of Haryana and other respondents.

Appearing before the Bench, advocate Anurag Chopra contended on the petitioner-society's behalf that statement of fact incorporated in the status reports submitted by the state governments was factually incorrect and that the infirmaries were not functional. Even the SPCAs at the district-level were not properly constituted.

"This court finds that it would be expedient to ascertain the statement of fact as reflected in the status reports submitted by the states of Haryana and Punjab and controverted by the petitioner(s) by sending the local commissioners to different districts across for both states," Justice Bhardwaj added. — TNS

Dallewal's fast enters Day 4

While Bharti Kisan Union (Ekta-Sidhupur) president Jagjit Singh Dallewal continued his fast unto death for fourth day on Tuesday, senior police and civil officers tried to prevail upon the farmer leader to end his fast.

Jaskaran Singh, IG, accompanied by Faridkot SSP Raj Pal Sandhu met Dallewal today and requested him to end his fast as the state government was considering all his demands. The IG said the health of Dallewal was good and he was in high spirits.

Punjab Vidhan Sabha Speaker Kultar Singh Sandhwan also met Dallewal and enquired about his well-being. Dallewal is on fast since Saturday. BKU (Ekta-Sidhupur) is staging dharnas in Amritsar, Mansa, Patiala, Faridkot and Bathinda urging the state government to fulfil their demands.

Dallewal is sitting on a fast unto death on Amritsar-Bathinda National Highway at Faridkot. Farmer union demands include increased compensation for land acquired for national highway projects, compensation for

crop damage due to inclement weather, cancellation of cases against farmers and bonus for wheat yield loss.

A team of doctors from Faridkot Civil Hospital is keeping a constant watch on the health of Dallewal who declined to end his protest till the government issued a notification to implement the accepted demands of the farmers.

Dallewal is also demanding an inquiry into CM Bhagwant

Mann's assertion that some organisations were holding protests to get funds and it had become a custom. It was after CM's statement that Dallewal had started fast unto death at the Faridkot protest site on Saturday.

Dallewal said the state government at its meeting with the farmers on October 6 had promised to fulfil their demands but nothing had been done in this regard.

SGPC plans signature campaign for release of 'Bandi Singhs' from Dec 1

The Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee (SGPC) has chalked out a plan to conduct a nationwide signature campaign to enable the masses to join with its endeavour for early release of 'Bandi Singhs' (Sikh political prisoners) languishing in jails despite completion of their sentences.

The signature campaign will be launched from December 1 to spread awareness among the sangat about the cases of Sikh prisoners and the punishments they had served.

The centre of this campaign will be the SGPC office in Amritsar, while sub-centres will

be established in every district of Punjab and Sikh missions outside Punjab. A written and digital record will also be maintained simultaneously.

In another decision, the SGPC executive, in the light of Akal Takht directions, appealed to the Union Government to observe the martyrdom day of Sahibzadas as

'Sahibzade Shahadat Diwas' instead of 'Veer Bal Diwas'. "Martyrdom day of Sahibzadas is an important page of Sikh history, which should be observed as per the spirit of Sikh heritage and Gurnat (teachings of Sikh Gurus). Therefore, the Centre should change and announce the name of this day as 'Sahibzade Shahadat Diwas' as suggested by the committee formed by Akal Takht," said SGPC president Harjinder Singh Dhani.

The SGPC executive has decided to honour the dignitaries only with books instead of Siropa, shawl and mementoes in every educational institution. — TNS
