

Citizens FIRst: Mobile police stations sup for G20 and beyond in Delhi

Vehicle To Also Serve As Command Centre For Emergencies: Officials

New Delhi: With restrictions on road movement for the G20 Summit this weekend, Delhi Police will deploy a mobile police station in central Delhi to help people who want to lodge a complaint or file an FIR. The vehicle will also serve as a command centre in case of an emergency in the area. This arrangement is likely to continue after the global event, according to police sources.

Explaining the features of the moving police station, a source said a minibus has been modified and fitted with CCTV cameras, a public address system and provisions for computers, laptops, internet, walkie-talkie and other accessories. It also has a public display system that flashes important messages, like dos and don'ts during the G20 events. It has a water dispenser and an LED TV to track developments too.

Other sources said the mobile po-

lice station will be a replica of a regular one. "The officer in charge of the mobile police station will be of the inspector rank, assisted by a duty officer, sub-inspector and investigating officers as in a normal police station. If need be, more personnel will be deployed," one of them revealed.

The vehicle has seating for four to five people, allowing them to have meetings in crisis times. In case of an emergency, the mobile police station can drive to the spot and function as a

temporary police station for the locality. "It can receive complaints from people, facilitating the start of investigations. The facility will also come in handy during law-and-order problems," the source added.

Areas where the mobile facility will be sent include places with distant police stations or police posts. "It will be operational all the time during the G20 summit, with the police-manning it working in shifts," the source said.

Govt agencies spent ₹511Cr to make Delhi summit-ready

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New Delhi: Infrastructure development, beautification and maintenance ahead of the G20 summit in Delhi has collectively cost different agencies involved in the project Rs 511 crore.

Delhi Police, New Delhi Municipal Corporation, Public Works Department of the Delhi government, Delhi Development Authority and the union ministry of road transport and highways are among the biggest spenders on making the capital ready for the prestigious international convention. The heads of 29 countries, including 19 member nations and 10 guests, will assemble in the city for the two-day mega event on September 19 and 20.

The capital witnessed massive preparations ahead of the convention with several central and state government agencies joining hands to beautify the city.

The major works carried out by various agencies in-

cluded micro-surfacing and blacktopping of roads, road marking, repairing of streetlights and footpath, installation of missing street furniture, fountains and sculpture, horticulture works and G20 branding.

According to the data accessed by TOI, Delhi Police incurred a total expenditure of Rs 340 crore. The money was largely spent on procuring security gadgets such as Russian Dragunov sniper rifles, chain and bolt cutters, drones, additional close circuit television cameras, and cars for both local and traffic police. NDMC spent Rs 60 crore, the contribution made by PWD, the ministry of road transport and highways, DDA, and the department of environment and forest stood at Rs 45 crore, Rs 26 crore, Rs 18 crore and Rs 16 crore, respectively.

MCD spent about Rs five crore, while the ministry of external affairs and military engineering services together spent a meagre Rs 75 lakh

on preparations.

The issue of expenditure made by different agencies snowballed into a controversy last week with the Delhi unit of Bharatiya Janata Party claiming that the Centre had funded the preparations and the Aam Aadmi Party government claiming that its request for Rs 927 crore had been turned down by the union government.

In an interview to TOI last week, PWD minister Atishi had said that the money expenditure on beautification work had been borne by PWD, MCD and the environment department from its own coffers. To beautify Delhi, the government agencies have placed over 6.7 lakh potted plants, planted 42 lakh shrubs at 33 important roads, built 150 fountains of different dimensions at various locations, installed 100 sculptures, revamped 61 roads and 39 parks, beautified 17 flyovers, and removed 15,000 metric tonnes of solid waste.

Rajasthan plans to keep Veerus rooted to the ground

Jaipur: Rajasthan's overhead public water tanks, which are at least five storeys tall or more, have been the site of tales reminiscent of Veeru's suicide scene in Sholay. Over the past year, the state has witnessed people threatening to enact their own dramatic exits by ascending these tanks, and in some shocking instances, actually following through with it.

There have also been multiple instances of protesters climbing onto these towering hulks to convey their grievances to the government. So, the state's public health and engineering department responded by deciding to make

structural changes to these tanks and thwart protests, blackmails, and suicides.

At the 612th meeting of PHED's technical committee, way back on March 15, 2015, a notification was issued to implement safety features. Fast forward to Wednesday, and the department decided to

double down on safety measures for these tanks, officially known as overhead service reservoirs. According to the updated notification, staircases in newly constructed tanks will start a staggering 4.5m above ground. To access the stairs, engineers and maintenance workers will have to channel their inner Veeru by scaling them with a specific type of foldable ladder.

But what about the older tanks where structural changes may not be feasible? They won't be left behind in this makeover. The notification advises installing a gate at the entrance to the staircase. Beyond this gate, only PHED employees and workers will be allowed access.

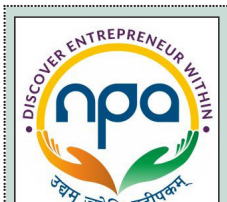
