

Modi lands in Amman as India, Jordan mark 75th anniversary of ties

IN WHAT can be viewed as the latest to India's engagement with West Asia, Prime Minister Narendra Modi is meeting Jordan's King Abdullah II bin Al Hussein in Amman on Monday — the same day External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar is visiting Abu Dhabi to meet Sheikh Abdullah bin Zayed Al Nahyan, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs of the UAE. On Tuesday, Jaishankar will visit Israel and meet his counterpart Gideon Sa'ar.

Modi, who reached Amman Monday afternoon, was received by the Prime Minister of Jordan, Jafar Hassan, at the airport as a special gesture. Modi posted on X, "Landed in Amman. Thankful to Mr Jafar Hassan, Prime Minister of the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan for the warm welcome at the airport. I am sure this visit will boost bilateral linkages between our nations."

Jordan, which is a neighbour of Israel and Palestine, has been deeply impacted by the war in Gaza and has major stakes in the reduction of tension between Israeli forces and Hamas.

Even as the ceasefire in Gaza is supposed to move to the second phase of the deal after the release of the hostages, the Sunday terrorist attack in Australia on Jewish people who

had gathered on the Bondi beach near Sydney to celebrate Hanukkah has once again brought the challenge of terrorism and extremism to the forefront.

The challenge is expected to be discussed during Jaishankar's visit to the UAE on Monday and Israel on Tuesday. Gaza peace plan of US President Donald Trump is also likely to come up for discussion.

While India-Jordan political ties have deepened in recent years, Jordan has been a bulwark in West Asia against radicalisation, extremism and terrorism. The country is also playing an important role in the West Asia peace process. "There is a meeting of mind between India and Jordan in dealing with terrorism as a global challenge," officials said.

In addition, Jordan is an important partner for India to meet its food security needs. India imports a significant amount of fertilizer from the country and has also invested in the potash and phosphate sectors there. There is further potential for such investments to secure India's requirements, officials said. India is the fourth largest trading partner of Jordan, with bilateral trade worth USD 2.875 billion in 2023-24.

This year marks the 75th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic ties between the two countries, and officials said that this is the first full-fledged bilateral visit to Jordan by PM Modi — after a gap of 37 years. PM Modi had transited through Jordan in February 2018, while on his way to the State of Palestine.

Besides political and economic areas, defence is another area of cooperation since India and Jordan signed the MoU on Defence Cooperation in 2018. Defence officials from both sides have visited each other's countries, and the two sides are discussing taking it forward.

SITTING IN one of the labyrinthine lanes of Gafoor Basti in Uttarakhand's Haldwani, Mohammad Aman Ansari goes through last month's accounts, his eyes darting to the phone beside him. He is waiting for news on the Supreme Court hearing in the land-encroachment case on which the fate of the anganwadi hinges. "It might not come up today as well," the 29-year-old tells *The Indian Express*. "It has been a long wait." He has reason to be anxious. The anganwadi is among 4,365 structures caught in a protracted legal battle involving the state government and the Indian Railways.

Spread across 2.2 km near the Gaula River and four Haldwani localities — Indira Colony, Dholak Basti, Gafoor Basti and Lane 7 — the structures are marked for demolition, with the government calling them unauthorised. The SC is hearing a special leave petition (SLP) against the Uttarakhand High Court's 2022 eviction order. The petition was last heard on November 14, with the next hearing tentatively on December 16. For the localities' 50,000 residents, who say they have documents proving rightful occupation, an adverse ruling could be decisive.

"Humare gale pe talwar rakhii hui hai (A sword's hanging over our heads)," says Zubaeda, 65, of Gafoor Basti. "If they ask us to leave, we will, because who can fight the government? But I believe the SC will not order our eviction." Among the 4,365 structures are not just shanties

but schools, government intercolleges, a primary health centre, an Uttarakhand Jal Sansthan office and religious structures — some dating to the 1930s. They also include, as per Mohammad Yusuf, an advocate who represented some residents, buildings labelled and auctioned as enemy property after Partition and later purchased by residents. "Some have lease deeds from 1968. While some of these have expired, some have had it made freehold property with the approval of the government local body," he says.

While residents cite sale and lease deeds to assert lawful occupation, the Railways claims it has its own evidence — maps, a 1959 notification, 1971 revenue records and a 2017 survey — to show it owns the 30 hectares on which these structures stand.

Allegations of encroachment first reached the HC in 2007, when a lawyer from neighbouring UP, linked to the Uttarakhand HC Bar Association,

sought a train from Allahabad to Kathgodam. Yusuf says, "The HC issued notice to the railway, which claimed, as a result of the so-called encroachments, it didn't have the space for a new line."

The issue resurfaced in 2013 through a PIL into the collapse of a Gaula River bridge. A court-mandated probe later alleged illegal mining, with the Railways linking it to encroachments. In 2017, the HC ordered clearance, followed by eviction notices. The SC stayed the eviction and asked the HC to hear affected individuals. The HC directed the Railways to appoint an Estate Officer, issue notices and hear objections. The Estate Officer rejected the objections and ruled in favour of the Railways, prompting residents to appeal in the district court, where some appeals remain pending. The case resurfaced in 2022, when the HC ordered eviction. Residents moved the top court,

2007: Petition in Uttarakhand High Court seeks a train from Allahabad to Kathgodam; Railways alleges encroachments. Matter subsides.

2013: PIL seeks inquiry into a bridge collapse; probe panel blames illegal mining and encroachment allegations resurface.

2016: High Court passes interim order to clear the land; state government seeks review.

2016-17: Joint Railways-district administration survey identifies 4,365 "encroachments".

which stayed the order on January 5, 2023. In July 2024, acting on an application from the Centre and the Railways, the court directed authorities to identify the required land, list affected families and prepare a rehabilitation plan. But there has been little progress since, petitioners' counsel says.

Among the structures marked for demolition are government buildings — a Government Girls Intercollege in Banbhoolpura with 1,074 students, established in 2003; a Government Intercollege in Indira Nagar with 400 students, established in 1985; an upper primary school with over 80 students, established in 1944; and a primary school with 284 students, established in 1944.

Nainital District Magistrate Lalit Mohan Royal, under whom Haldwani falls, says the state has no policy for "rehabilitating encroachers". On government schools, he says the administration will follow SC orders. The area falls under the Izzatnagar Rail Division of the North Eastern Railway (NER). While Izzatnagar Divisional Rail Manager Veena Sinha didn't respond to queries, the NER's chief public relations officer declined to comment on a matter "that was sub judice".

As the ruling nears, police have been deployed in Banbhoolpura to prevent flare-ups. Haldwani MLA and Congress leader Sumit Hridayesh says, "There is a 50-acre empty patch near the tracks they (Railways) can use. Why do you want development at the cost of razing a poor man's house?"

Goa nightclub fire: Luthra brothers to be brought back today

THE LUTHRA brothers, owners of club Birch by Romeo Lane in Goa where a fire killed 25 people, will be brought to Delhi from Thailand by officials of central agencies on Tuesday, *The Indian Express* has learnt.

Soon after their arrival, the Goa Police will arrest them in Delhi and take them to Goa for further investigation. According to sources, a central agency team has already reached the location where the two brothers — Gaurav and Saurabh — were detained by Thailand authorities last week. The duo will be brought back to Delhi on Tuesday evening after the completion of legal formalities in Thailand.

According to investigators, the brothers booked tickets to Thailand less than two hours after the midnight blaze at the night club on December 6 and

flew out early Sunday morning. The two were detained by Thai authorities in Phuket following an intervention by the Indian Embassy. The Thai authorities took action as per local laws.

Both brothers were attending a wedding in Delhi when the fire broke. A staff member informed them about the blaze, and they immediately made plans to leave the country, according to the police probe.

Goa police had said the brothers booked tickets to Thailand within 90 minutes of the blaze. The Goa police had said the investigation revealed that the brothers booked the tickets at 1.17 am on December 7.

By December 7 evening, a lookout circular was issued against them by the Bureau of Immigration at the request of the Goa Police. Later, a Blue Corner Notice was issued and the Ministry of External Affairs revoked their passports.

NIA's Pahalgam chargesheet: 2 phones crucial link to Pak hand

TWO ANDROID phones found at the site of the Dachigam encounter in July are clinching evidence that the Pahalgam terrorists were from Pakistan, the National Investigation Agency (NIA) chargesheet filed in connection with the April terror attack states, it is learnt.

The chargesheet was filed before the Special NIA Court in Jammu on Monday.

Speaking in the Lok Sabha in July, Union Home Minister Amit Shah had announced that three terrorists gunned down in the Dachigam forest area on the outskirts of Srinagar were the same as those involved in the April 22 terror attack. He identified the three as Suleiman alias Faisal Jatt, Afghan and Jibran,

and said they had all come from Pakistan.

The NIA chargesheet has relied on, among other things, the two phones found at the encounter site, sources said, adding that the probe agency has confirmed the devices were "bought in Pakistan". The chargesheet is over 1,500 pages and details the conspiracy, roles of the accused, and supporting evidence.

The chargesheet has been filed against seven accused (both individuals and terror outfits), including the three Pakistani terrorists killed during 'Operation Mahadev' at Dachigam.

The document also names Pakistani "handler" Sajid Jatt and the terrorist outfit Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT)/The Resistance Front (TRF) as accused. "The banned terrorist organisation

LeT/TRF has been charge-sheeted for its role in planning, facilitating, and executing the Pahalgam attack," it states.

Two other accused, Kashmir residents Parvaiz Ahmad and Bashir Ahmad Jothar, were arrested by the NIA on June 22, 2025, for harbouring militants and have been challaned under Section 19 of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, 1967. Both are in judicial custody, the agency said.

The agency is learnt to have stated that during their interrogation, they disclosed the identities of the three armed terrorists involved in the attack, and confirmed that they were Pakistani nationals affiliated to the LeT.

The Pahalgam terror attack left 25 tourists and one local civilian dead.

Former Justice Secretary Raj Kumar Goyal sworn in as CIC

PRESIDENT DROUPADI Murmu Monday administered the oath of office to retired IAS officer Raj Kumar Goyal as Chief Information Commissioner in the Central Information Commission, the Rashtrapati Bhavan said.

Rashtrapati Bhavan shared a photo on X of the swearing-in ceremony, which was attended by Vice-President C P Radhakrishnan, Principal Secretary to the Prime Minister P K Mishra and Union MoS for Personnel Dr Jitendra Singh, among others.

The post has been vacant since September when the then-CIC Heeralal Samariya demitted office.

Goyal, a 1990-batch IAS officer of the J&K cadre and later the AGMUT cadre when the state of J&K became an UT in 2019, retired in August this year from the post of Secretary, Department of Justice. Before that, he had served in the Ministry of Home Affairs and the External Affairs Ministry.

Later in the day, the Department of Personnel and Training published the appointment notification that read, "The President, on the recommendations of the committee constituted under sub-section (3) of Section 12 of the Right to Information Act, 2005 (22 of 2005), is pleased to appoint Shri Raj Kumar Goyal as the Chief Information Commissioner in the Central Information Commission with effect from the forenoon of 15th December, 2025." As per the rules, the term of a CIC is three years.

The President also appointed eight Information Commissioners on Monday.
